NATIONAL BLOOD DONOR MONTH – JANUARY

In January, the American Red Cross celebrates National Blood Donor Month and recognizes the lifesaving contribution of blood and platelet donors. As we begin the New Year, the Red Cross encourages individuals to resolve to roll up a sleeve to give this month and throughout the year.

National Blood Donor Month has been observed in January since 1970 with the goal of increasing blood and platelet donations during winter – one of the most difficult times of year to collect enough blood products to meet patient needs. During the winter months, inclement weather often results in cancelled blood drives, and seasonal illnesses like the flu may cause some donors to become temporarily unable to donate.

You can donate blood by calling the Red Cross in the area, or by contacting the local hospitals. Lancaster General has a blood donor center and will also schedule times to come to community locations and set up donor areas for your convenience. (Watch for one at St. Peters!)







Pastor's Letter

On the cover of the Christmas issue of one of the headier professional journals that I subscribe to, was this image entitled "My Beloved Is Gone Down into His Garden" from the Agnus Dei Liturgical Arts website. When I first got it in the mail, I thought it was an early Lenten or Easter issue, till I saw the "Christmas" title on the bottom of the magazine cover. As I thought about it, I smiled at this visual representation of something we

say a lot in the church around the Christmas season ... "Jesus is born in a cradle so as to die on a cross." Those words feel less harsh to me, however, than seeing a picture of Mary crying at the Garden Tomb in the middle of December (which is when I am writing this letter). But it is the right message for us if you are reading this copy of the Herald post-Christmas around the New Year holiday. Because while we are enjoying the waning days of the Christmas season, the Epiphany season is only a week away —



a season that invites our proclamation that the birth of this Jesus into the world will also become the arrival of the Messiah into our lives. And of course, as that Epiphany season concludes at the end of February, we will land in the Lenten season of reflection upon the death of that Messiah. Yes, this Garden Tomb we see here is not that far off in the future after all.

And isn't that the heart of the message which defines us all year long, whether we are in the Lenten or Easter season, or the Christmas or Pentecost or Epiphany seasons? Namely that whatever story of Jesus we are reading, or whatever teaching of Jesus that we are embracing, or whatever miracle of Jesus we are celebrating ... that we are seeing that Jesus through the lens of the Cross and Resurrection. That is the lens through which we view every Christian teaching and every Christian experience. It is part of our funeral liturgy and part of our wedding liturgy. It is heard in Lenten sermons and fall Pentecost sermons. It is celebrated when we sit at the bedside of a dying parent and at the crib of a new-born baby. We are not the children of God fashioned by our maker and redeemer, if we do not acknowledge the rhythm of life and death and life again in everything that we do.

So as you begin the New Year, with all of the celebrating and snacking and reflecting on how you are going to change your life through exercise and better eating habits ... remember and revisit what is the core of your Christian life. Namely that everything you do and everything you are is shaped and framed by the Easter event that awaits us liturgically in the months ahead ... and is also giving you life and vitality at this very moment and every day that you rise from your bed.

Letter From the Vicar



Grace, peace, and blessings to all my brothers and sisters in Christ at St. Peter's Lutheran Church this New Year.

Just a few weeks ago I was leaving work to go and pick up my daughter at daycare because my wife had to work an evening event. The daycare closes at 6pm and I simply needed to drive to Meg's work, swap cars with her because she had the car seat, and then drive to the daycare to pick up Lizzie. I left work at 4:30, as usual, giving myself an hour and a half to accomplish what should only take 45 minutes.

I left and headed up Lititz Pike where my GPS informed me that there was a wreck 2.8 miles ahead but "I was still on the fastest route." It took me almost 30 minutes to get to the first stoplight between the church and 30. It is now 5 o'clock and I now

have an hour to to make the trip and we are sitting still on Lititz Pike. I decide to turn around and run up Delp Rd. to Manheim Pike and see if I can get around the wreck on 30. Short answer... Nope. It takes me 45 minutes now to get to 30 on Manheim Pike. As I finally merge on to 30, I do so at the blazing fast speed of 10 mph. It is 5:45 by the time I get past the wreck and speeds return to normal; leaving me 15 minutes to make a trip that is absolutely impossible to make in that amount of time. My wife had to leave her event and pick up our daughter and I would have to meet them at the museum.

The point of this tale of adventure and frustration is that I knew where I needed to go and for all practical purposes I knew how to get there. For each and every block in the road I seemed to come to, I made what I felt to be appropriate detours only to find my path blocked yet again. I will admit there was a particular moment where I was so frustrated that I just wanted to give up, but I could not. There was a child that needed me and regardless of how many detours and variations in route I had to take.

This is a new year and a common item on peoples' to-do lists are the infamous New Year's Resolutions. People make these resolutions for all kinds of different reasons and very few of them even last past the first week because we run into stumbling blocks in our path, we lose track of our focus, and we give up. This happens not just with these New Year's resolutions but with lots of things in our lives. It even happens when our goal is to live a life loving our neighbor and following Christ on the "way." The goal, the destination, is noble and we can have a positive impact on the world. We always find a stumbling block at some point along the way and it can be very easy to lose our focus and simply give up on trying to make a change in the world.

That evening in December, there was a child that held my focus and gave me the drive to accomplish my task no matter how many detours I was forced to take; additionally, I had to find help to do so. As Christians, we just celebrated the birth of a very special child; a child that can hold our focus. As the saying goes, "tis the reason for the season." Living our life as a Christian is not an easy thing to do. When we find stumbling blocks in our path, this very special child, Christ can and should be our focus for where we want to go over the coming year. Sometimes we will feel as if it is absolutely impossible to reach our destination. Sometimes we will need help, but that is the beauty of being part of the body of Christ; there is help to be had. People working together, with Christ as their focus, can and do accomplish the seemingly impossible.

From the Director of Music

What is Liturgy?

It's the parts we sing every week! No, it's the sentences we sing at the beginning of communion! No, it's the parts we say together, like the Creed and Lord's Prayer! It's the whole service! Who lit whose tree?!

You've probably heard this word used before in conversations at church. "What a great liturgy!" we say. Have you ever wondered what this word means? It comes from an ancient

Greek word, *Leitourgia*, that is often translated to "work of the people." Sure. That makes sense. ... huh? It may seem like a terrible way to read a book, but as we look at this word we're going to start by looking at the end of that translation, "the people."

Liturgy is what all of us do together as a people of God.

Exactly who are those people? Sure, some of us gather at St. Peter's on Sunday mornings to worship God and receive God's word of grace in our lives. We may gather at different times or in different places, but the important thing is that we, who are from all walks of life, gather together. However, it doesn't stop there. People all over the city, county, state, country, and world gather together in their places of worship for the same reasons we do. That's just it. Worship is a community-oriented event. It is the community of faith who make up the "people" part of liturgy, not only those who are still with us, but also the saints who have gone before.

But what about the work? Sure, when we get together on Sunday morning we have a pattern for our worship. As some of the work we do, that pattern (sometimes called the *Ordo*, stay tuned!) has variations and flexibility built in to "work" for the people who are gathered. Yes, we sing, we praise, we recount, we pray the story of God's grace. However, in a glorious turnaround, God's grace, embodied by the words and actions we share, also works on us.

And yet, as Christians we are called to a life outside of the church building's walls. Called to serve our neighbors and love our enemies, perhaps it is the work we do outside of Sunday morning that is even more important. Indeed, we could interpret the word liturgy, "the work of the people," to mean our loving service to others stemming from a place of gratitude for the grace received through Jesus' death on a cross.

We may come to church on Sunday morning for the liturgy, but in a sense the true "work of the people" happens outside these walls as we follow Jesus' command to go and do likewise.
