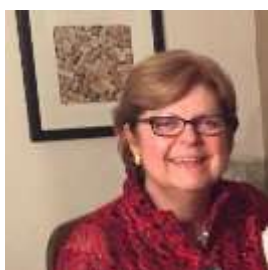

Brian Tolbert writes: From that first magic moment as a young scout watching an image appear on a piece of paper submerged in a sorcerer's solution, I was hooked. Here was a way to experience, express and capture all the wonders life has to offer. A high school camera club advisor pointed out that I could even make a career with photography. I was off and running! A scholarship from the Professional Photographers of America enabled a formal education at the Rochester Institute of Tech. where I received a BFA in Illustrative Photography and a Master of Photography from the PPA. Stints in the U.S. Army, traveling the country as a marketing representative and five years with EASTMAN KODAK as a photographic information specialist were the precursors to the ultimate goal of operating & owning my own studio. Along with my early introduction to photography was the awe inspiring RBB&B circus when it was under canvas. From the time I could walk, my father and I would stop in Reading at the Peanut store (now the famous Peanut Bar) for some bags of peanuts to feed the elephants. Not only was it exciting and entertaining, but also educational. Were you aware of the many CIRCUS LINGO colorful phrases that were more functional and eventually found their way out of the Big Top and into the mainstream of everyday speech... *Hold your horses. Tossing his hat in the ring. Jumbo. Rain or shine. Get the show on the road. Grandstanding...* and many more. I've been fortunate to be able to combine these two loves, by following and photographing many "Mud Shows" (Circuses that perform under canvas big tops). Among those presented here...Bentley Brothers Circus, Walker Brothers Circus, Moscow Circus, Russia's BIM BOM Circus, Clyde Beatty-Cole Bros. Circus, Cole Bros. Circus, Ringling Bros. Barnum & Bailey Circus. So.... Ladies, Gentlemen AND Children of all ages, I hope you will enjoy these photos as much as I did in creating them, and *may all your days be Circus days!*

August is: National Immunization Awareness Month (NIAM)

National Immunization Awareness Month (NIAM) is observed annually in August, to highlight the importance of vaccinations. This observance was established to encourage people of all ages to make sure they are up to date on the vaccines recommended for their age groups. Your Health and Wellness Committee wants to raise awareness about the important role vaccines play in preventing serious, sometimes deadly, diseases.

- We are reminding parents of the importance that vaccines play in protecting their child's health
- College students – do you talk to your healthcare professional about any vaccines you may need prior to college entry?
- Adults, especially older adults or those with chronic conditions, need to talk to their Doctor about vaccines they may need
- Pregnant women should be reminded: they need vaccines to protect their unborn child
- The next flu season is only a few months away. Make sure you're immunized. While the flu shot may not prevent you from getting the flu, it certainly decreases the symptoms of the flu.



Check with your [state or local health department\(https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/imz-managers/award-ee-imz-websites.html\)](https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/imz-managers/award-ee-imz-websites.html) to see if they have additional immunization resources you may be interested in reading about. And now may be a good time to have that Annual Wellness visit – to make sure you are as healthy as you can be!

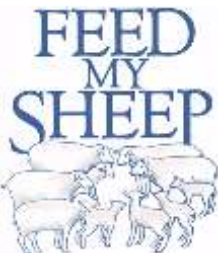


Thank You Island Gardeners!

Pastor's Letter

Love is fundamentally about looking forward, not backward. It's a commitment to becoming, not merely being. It's an enlistment in togetherness, not aloneness. In that way, Adam and Eve are an ideal couple. They don't have a past, they have only a future. They have no ancestors, they have only descendants. Also, they don't have antecedents who've been in love before, so they can't mimic the experience of anyone else. They can't steal someone else's pickup lines or dance to anyone else's love songs. They must write their own story. They must invent what it means to be in a relationship."

~~*The First Love Story: Adam, Eve, and Us* by Bruce Feiler

Dear Friends:

I used this quote as a prompt for a recent wedding homily. It is from the first book on my summer reading list, by Bruce Feiler, and is a great image for what couples should aspire to in a new marriage. But I share it with you, not so that we can chat about marriage and family and how many years we have been working on our relationships with those we love. No ... I share it, so that we can talk a bit about "mission" this month. As you already know, if you have seen the announcements the past couple of months, we are currently reworking our congregational mission statement. The work has begun with a "core values" survey, the formation of a small draft team to start sifting the date you created for us, and will continue in the coming weeks with that draft team getting some initial ideas about a new mission statement into your hands for review and input and reflection.



I share this marriage quote even as we talk about "mission", because in many ways congregational life is characterized by the word "covenant." We are people of God's covenant, and we are people who live covenantally with each other. The nature of the Church is to be in relationship, vertically with God and horizontally with each other. At the intersection of those vertical and horizontal lines is where the Christian finds the experience of faith, the call to service, and the assurance of the Spirit of God at work in our lives. In short, at that intersection of our human and divine relationships, we find Jesus ... alive and well among us.

So I would invite you to reflect upon this short quote from Bruce Feiler, and consider what it means for a church to be in covenant with God and God's people. I believe that Feiler would suggest that we are people who look more to the future than to the past ... we are people who celebrate that identity into which God is fashioning us ... we are people for whom the best chapters of our lives are yet to be written ... and we experience all of this best, when we do so in community instead of in isolation.

So give our mission statement process some thought ... watch for the opportunities that will arise that will allow you to be part of the process which will shape the final form of this statement. Be part of the people of God in this place and at this time, who may have our feet grounded in the footsteps of those who have preceded us, but who have our eyes firmly cast to the future and what God has in store for us as the people of God in Neffsville. Until then, I'll ...

Pastor Sarah's Message

Dear friends in Christ,

I hope that the summer has been filled with wonderful moments and cherished times. It is usually this time of the summer that I look at my calendar and wonder where the time has gone. I would like to offer you some “catch up” news that has been going on in my ministry as well as the greater ministry of the church.

Seminary News: During this past year the two Lutheran seminaries in our area, Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg and the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia, came together with plans to close their seminaries in order to become a new creation. This summer a year-long of planning came to fruition as the two historic institutions become United Lutheran Seminary (ULS). Along with the new creation, came new opportunities. Full time students who live on campus are currently able to attend tuition-free. This will go a long way in reducing student debt (believe me!). Classes are taking place at the Philadelphia and Gettysburg campus with teachers traveling between the two sites. Incoming student numbers to United Lutheran Seminary are up for the fall.

Synod News: A letter from Bishop Dunlop states, “As the Lower Susquehanna Synod encourages our congregations to reFORM, reNEW and reVISION their ministries for a changing world, we at our synod offices are also moving ahead with strategies to increase efficiency, boost mission effectiveness, and decrease costs. Last year we took some big initial steps, including upgrading our technology, switching IT support, and installing a new phone system. Those steps alone streamlined operations and saved tens of thousands of dollars.”

Furthermore, the synod leaders will be focusing on how we do ministry in our various regions. The Bishop and the conference deans will be brainstorming on how we may form into “mission districts” that can help facilitate communication and collaboration with each other. It is one of the ways we can be a synod together so that each church need not “reinvent the wheel.” It will be interesting to see how our various churches in our conference can grow in mission to the community!

Pastor Sarah News: This summer I was selected as a Fellow in the Clergy Leadership Program (CLP) of Central Pennsylvania. The program begins this September with a retreat and meets every other month for the next two years. The cohort in which I am part will convene at Messiah College. The program is designed to engage with pastors who have experienced five-ten years of parish ministry. The purpose of the program is to enhance the participant’s capacities as congregational pastors, and will also inspire participants to think creatively about our leadership role in the broader community. The CLP will connect me and my fellow “Fellows” with leaders from other sectors of society such as government, business, health care, education, and the arts. Funded through the Lilly Endowment Inc, Messiah College can host the program with no expense to me. I truly look forward to the learning opportunities and enrichment that I may receive as a fellow of the clergy leadership program. For more information you can go to <http://www.messiah.edu/clp>

From the Director of Music

Report from *Rise: Remember Well the Future* a Conference of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians

I write this having come to the end of a fulfilling week in Minneapolis, MN at the 2017 National Conference of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians. We have gathered together as a group of people who care deeply about leading people in proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ through song. There have been opportunities to worship together, to reconnect with colleagues, to let our hair down, and to consider our work as church musicians.

One of the keynote speeches this week focused on the word ‘Cantor.’ We often think of this word in relation to the psalms – where the verses are sung responsively between one person (the cantor) and the rest of the gathered people. At the conference, we learned about the history behind this term, with its distinctly Lutheran heritage, as a title for the person in the church who is charged with cultivating the people’s song whether by leading a choir or playing for services.

In this 500th anniversary year of Martin Luther’s 95 theses, it seems appropriate not only to think about how we can claim our past, but also how we continually reform. Near the end of our conference of Lutheran Church Musicians, we gathered with the monks of a Roman Catholic Abbey (St. John’s Abbey in Collegeville) and prayed together with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. This moving service emphasized our shared heritage as members of the body of Christ and was a hopeful turn toward the future.

Worship at the conference was inspiring. There were countless varieties of styles presented, but one that stuck with me was the paperless music we engaged in. During these times, a worship leader invited us to sing music led through call and response. Such music gathered us together through a shared learning experience and served the needs of our worship perfectly.

I’m looking forward to incorporating some of what I’ve learned this week into our worship together at St. Peter’s. Until then, blessings for a great end of the summer!
