
St. Peter's offers three distinct classes for our adults during the Sunday School hour

Making a resolution for Healthy Vision

Glaucoma is a leading cause of vision loss and blindness in the United States. People are often unaware: glaucoma has no symptoms in its early stages! Glaucoma is a group of diseases that can damage the eye's optic nerve. The most common type? Open-angle glaucoma.

If detected early, before noticeable vision loss occurs, glaucoma can usually be controlled and severe vision loss can often be prevented. Vision that is lost from glaucoma *cannot* be restored.

Anyone can get glaucoma, but those at higher risk include:

- African Americans over age 40
- Everyone over age 60, especially Hispanics/Latinos
- People with a family history of the disease

Almost 3 million people ages 40 and older have glaucoma, yet only half know it.

So, when thinking about those New Year resolutions, put: 'have my vision checked' first. Call your eye doctor today, and asked to get screened for Glaucoma.

From Your Prayer Chain....



Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends:

In the Church crowd, we know it as "The Name of Jesus" festival. The world calls it New Year's Day. Both occur on January 1st, as we start off the year of 2018. I obviously recognize that even church folks don't pay attention to the Name of Jesus festival, because we are so rarely in church on January 1st. But I call your attention to it this month as a point of reflection on the New Year. Anyone who breathes and takes nourishment has heard more than their fair share of "New Year's resolution" talk. We are obsessed as a culture with "newness" and from a human perspective, fresh starts give us a chance to jettison old habits and adopt new ones. While I can be a bit Scroogish around this time of the year with our

cultural obsessions, even I get the elan of that.

In some ways, New Year's resolutions are an attempt to name ourselves anew. You define yourself differently, with the intent of becoming that definition. You gift yourself a new "name," and strive to live into that name. New January names that are routinely popular ones across our lands are ones like ... Mr. Skinnier ... Mrs. Healthier ... Sir Non-smoker ... Ms. Thriftier ... Madam Exerciser. We state publicly or privately who we want to become, and try to make that dubbing more than just a hollow name ... but a new reality.



Fair enough. Goals rarely do us harm when we set them for ourselves, even when we don't meet them, or don't meet them as completely as we hoped. So have at it. But maybe this year, as you start the year off your traditional names of *Sauerkraut Eater* ... or *Bowl Game Watcher* ... or *Couch Denizen* ... consider the names of the one from whom we have all taken our spiritual name of Christian. Remember some of the names that have been gifted



to Jesus ... Wonderful Counselor ... Savior ... Redeemer ... King of Kings and Lord of Lords ... Deliverer ... Son of God and Son of Man.

Remember also, the names that define us in relation to Jesus ... *Child of God* ... *Friend of Jesus* ... *Baptized* ... *Heir to Christ* ... *Saint*. And remember that while we will not be in worship on January 1st, we will observe Name Tag Sunday the following Sunday, January 7th. Celebrate that together with your fellow worshipers, and start off the year with a clear statement that you embrace the various names God has bestowed upon you. Yes, on the 7th I hope to ...

Pastor Sarah's Message

Greetings friends in Christ,

I pray that your Christmas season was filled with holy moments. Some of those moments may have been more quiet and contemplative, and others may have been filled with lots more noise and jubilee. And now we begin the New Year.

The other day I was doing the laundry and thinking about this time of year. I find that doing the laundry is a good time to ponder...not only about what shirts to wash, but ponder some of life's bigger issues. I found myself a bit jealous of one of Elsa's shirts. Looking at it I could tell you that she had peanut butter in the morning, fruit juice in the afternoon, and spaghetti sauce in the evening. And yet, I knew that all I had to do was put it in our washer with a little extra deter-

gent and it would come out clean. No stains, no tales of misplaced food, simply clean with a "fresh scent" smell!

And I was a bit jealous of that shirt!

It also made me think of my college and grad school days around this time of year. Beginning around Thanksgiving (when I would come home with 100 pounds of laundry), it would feel like the weight of the world was upon my shoulders. I would usually have two 5-page papers, one 10-page paper, and a final exam bearing down upon me. The time from the last week of November to the third week of December would be fraught with research, study, writing, and late nights. But then, blessedly, the term would end! And having turned in all that was due, I had a break. The new semester hadn't started yet. And I found that I got the best sleep during that holiday break. Everything was new.

These years post college and graduate schools, I don't have the same rhythm, and I miss it sometimes. I think I mostly miss that sense of peace when one thing ended and another had yet to begin. I think it's why I can be a bit jealous of a shirt. Though 2018 is just beginning, I feel the responsibilities, my own expectations, and the history of prior years upon me. How I miss the college reset button. How I wish I could be a shirt that could blissfully be cleaned and all the history and stains of the past removed.

I think the closest I can get to being a clean shirt is remembering my baptism.

I was 2 weeks old at the time, so I don't remember it (my parents tell stories of my cuteness), however, I can remember that I am indeed baptized. That means that no matter what stains I get, what missteps and mud holes I encounter, or blots of life that occur, God is there ready to clean me off with the "fresh scent" of forgiveness.

Perhaps living into the reality of my baptism means that I can forgive myself or let go of some of the history and burdens of "semesters" past. God tells us that in Christ a "new thing" is occurring. Maybe in this New Year, we can receive the daily reset button of God's grace and live into the fresh ways of God.

From the Director of Music

Time after Epiphany

With the trimmings and trappings of Christmas behind us, this time of year can often be a bit of a letdown. It almost seems like we spend so much time preparing for Jesus' arrival into our lives again that when he finally gets here we are caught off guard by what we're being asked to do. This is particularly ironic given the message of Advent is "Get Ready!"

Often the appointed readings for the time after Epiphany (Remember, Epiphany is just one day, January 6th) center around call stories. On January 7th, Baptism of our Lord, we read the call story of our Lord and Savior, Jesus as God's servant; January 14th, we hear of Samuel's calling and the calling of the first disciples; and the Gospel on January 21st is the story of the calling of the fishermen disciples. It isn't until January 28th that we hear about the healing of one with an unclean spirit.

It isn't only the Gospel stories that speak of God's call, the appointed psalms for these Sundays also follow the call theme. We sing of God's powerful voice in Psalm 29, the Lord searches us out in Psalm 139, and God speaks to us personally in Psalm 62. The psalms encapsulate a wide range of human experience and relationship with God, and these examples speak across the ages to us today.

We respond to these themes and share them in the music we sing with some of the great call songs in our hymnal. "Here I Am, Lord," "You Have Come Down to the Lakeshore," "We Are Called," and "The Summons" are centerpieces of this time of year. God calls us and we respond eagerly to the call.

As I said earlier, this time of year can be a letdown after the glitter of Christmas. Perhaps God calls us this time of year to remind us that the darkness comes to an end. While some of the coldest days may be ahead of us, the darkest days are behind us. The days are getting longer and we are looking forward to the mountaintop experience of Transfiguration a few short weeks away. Perhaps God calls us to prepare us for the spiritual plain of Lent which eventually leads to the cross. Perhaps there's something else in our lives, or in the life of the church now that God is calling us to.

Spend some time thinking with me about what God may be calling you or us to this year and let us remain open to those places where we might respond by saying, "Send me!"




