


Live Streaming From the Sanctuary



You may have noticed that the last few weeks **Church@Home** has been live streamed from the sanctuary. Wiring a network port in the AV room has

allowed us to move out of the Teichmann house and into the sanctuary.

At this time we are using a borrowed camera that is functioning as a higher quality webcam. Church leaders are leading worship with the sanctuary as a background. A more sophisticated camera option



has been ordered and will be available later this summer. In the future, with the aid of the PTZ (pan-tilt-zoom) camera, the worship space can be used in a more interactive way.

Safe Church Recommendations

Due to the recent protocol put out by Governor Wolf with groups limiting to 25 persons, especially indoors, we recommend waiting until Labor Day or after for in person worship. We will reevaluate at our next Safe Church meeting which is August 13th.

In person Christian education is also on hold and will again be discussed at our August meeting.

A final decision on preschool classes is on hold pending local school district decisions.

Issues that are guiding our recommendations:

- Governor Wolf's recent order of groups limiting to 25
- The taxing on the HVAC system for total outside air which would increase the humidity in the sanctuary on hot days.
- Lack of adequate ventilation in our Christian education wings.
- Lack of volunteer teachers for in person classes.
- Responses of the worship survey that stated that 60 percent of persons who responded did not feel ready to come to in person worship.

We are hoping to continue our community meal distribution. We also have a need for volunteers for Lydia's closet. Many of our current volunteers are unable to serve at this time. We are looking for persons who are willing to give some time to help, with masks and social distancing. Contact Sister Dottie at <u>dottie.almoney@stpeterslutheran.org</u> if you can help.

Stewardship Update



Our records through the end of June 2020 indicate that we are currently 2.2% ahead of financial giving compared to last year's (2019) giving summary at the mid-year point. Three of our four giving categories that make up our normal giving (General Fund, Debt Reduction and Loose Plate Offerings) are all up from last year. The only place we are behind last year's giving numbers is in our Easter offering, which was clearly impacted by having no in-person worship services. Your

Council, Stewardship, Finance and Staff leaders could not be more pleased with your strong stewardship efforts. Thank you, and may the blessing of your personal stewardship discipline continue.

Benevolence Payments

Please be aware that through the month of July, we are fully up to date on all of our benevolent commitments, and have also paid in full the yearly funds to our local benevolent commitments here in Lancaster. With your strong and sacrificial offerings, we have been able to be generous to local charities and missions which are part of our benevolence budget, as they struggle to keep their ministries vibrant and functioning.

HVAC Update

Our church staff has been meeting with technicians from the HVAC company Dynatech Controls, in order to receive training on the newly installed HVAC control system. While the system is somewhat complicated, there is a great opportunity to manage the heating and cooling needs of the church through modern digital technology. This new system allows us to have a very healthy fresh air exchange in our church sanctuary and narthex, which is a critical component in getting back to worship when the government restrictions are eased and we have our safety protocols in place. Please be patient with our church staff as they learn the nuances of the new HVAC system, and learn to control it and use it to the church's advantage.

Updates to the Church Directory

Sometime in the next few months, you will be receiving a call from either a staff member or a volunteer asking to update your family's information. You will be asked to correct your address, phone numbers, and email addresses since much of our data is outdated. We are also trying to categorize our adult children as to whether they are attending or have moved on to another worship experience.

The goal is to establish an accurate membership roll. It is part of the important strategic plan that is being developed. If you receive a message, please respond. It is important to our future!

Strategic Planning

Do you remember back to the beginning of 2020? I know it's foggy and some memories are hazy, but back in January 2020 we began our Feasibility Study for a Mission Campaign. Richie and Rachel Musser from Kirby-Smith Associates came and gave temple talks and offered a Q&A session. Many of you filled out questionnaires and surveys and spoke directly with Richie and Rachel.

On March 9, Richie Musser offered the results of the Feasibility Study to the council. Shortly after this meeting, the church responded to the Covid-19 crisis. While St. Peter's has yet to vote as a congregation to move forward on a Capital Campaign, this vote will occur, whether in person or by digital means. More information about that process will be forthcoming.

In the meantime, leaders from Stewardship, Finance, and the Campaign Steering Committees wanted to keep up the positive momentum and began to look into the process of creating a strategic plan. Based on our mission and vision, this plan will focus on ways we may strategize our ministries and create a 'blueprint' for the stewardship of our campus facilities.

In the July Council meeting, the council moved to form a Strategic Planning Committee and to contract with Richie Musser to begin the process of Strategic Planning. This process will be grounded in our mission and vision statements, and from these statements clear objectives and goals will be defined. The process will also include a Ministry Audit gathering vital information from ministry leaders. From this process we hope to see with eyes of faith on the ways that God is calling us into God's future.

Make sure to keep your physician visits & immunizations



During this pandemic, it's still very important that everyone with chronic conditions, and children who need immunizations keep their physician visits. These "follow up visits" and "well child checks" are important to assure conditions are monitored, and children are assessed for proper development, secure immunizations, and maybe uncover and treat anything that may be found.

You may have heard that parents are avoiding taking their children to the doctor's office because of the Coronavirus. Therefore their children may be missing important vaccines.

With the potential for school to be back in session in the fall, it's necessary to make/keep these visits.

Adults are no different. Many of us avoided the doctor's office over the past few months, even though telemedicine visits were made available, or we were experiencing problems. It's time to call and get our health evaluated and things back on track. Our health depends on it.




Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends:

One of my vacation activities, that carried through three of the days our little Sammy was visiting with us here in Lancaster, was building the Kinex Ball Factory. This is an oldie, but goodie in the toy world. I remember building the Ball Factory more than 20 years ago on Christmas Day ... all of Christmas Day, if my memory serves me ... so that by the time St. Stephen's feast day rolled around on December 26th, Justin could actually play with it. It triggered in Justin a love of many Kinex products that is still with him, in some ways (as evidenced by his unwillingness to part with the thirty-gallon plastic bin of Kinex pieces in our basement), along with all the various assembly booklets that originally accompanied those pieces.

Snapping together the 3,152 plastic pieces that make up the Ball Factory, gives a person time to think. And think, I did. The tower is made with only 15-20 different types of plastic pieces. They are different shapes and colors and sizes. Some look stronger than others ... some connect more easily than others ... there are more of some pieces than others ... some are more flexible than others ... every one, however, needs to be snapped into place. Every one has a significant role in the overall ensemble of construction. Every piece is part of the greater whole. You know where I am going with this, don't you?



As I built, and also listened to CNN droning on the TV in the background, I found myself thinking of the world we currently live in ... at least here in America. We have great diversity in terms of identities, races, ideologies and passions. We have great diversity in terms of how well we "fit" into the ensemble of the culture around us. And some of us (like my delightful Kinex pieces) are

more pliable than others who cherish rigidity. Some of us are loved and admired and marveled over. Some are tolerated and resented and seen as just plain old contrary. But we all fit into the construction of whatever "We the people" means in our constitution. And I found myself recalling the counsel of one of our "Saints Triumphant" ... Earl Popp (God rest his soul), who regularly advised me to revisit the Constitution, for the purpose of seeing in print, the goal (idealistic as it may have been) of a vast array of diverse people coming together into "one nation under God." Yes, I snuck into the mix, a bit of our Pledge of Allegiance, too.

As I look at our world, I see people consumed with "absolutes" ... radical, isolated and narrowly defined values that struggle to play nicely with others. I see sharply defined litmus tests by which everyone is judged (and often found lacking). I see camps of people circling the wagons, and holding others at bay. And I wonder how we can find a path to unity in the midst of our diversity, when there is just so much anger and righteous indignation flying through our preferred platforms of communication. I wonder how we can find our way back to the ideology of the Constitution. I wonder what Earl Popp would think. I wonder what his sage advice would be.

I have no answers, as you already know. But as a Christian, I trust that the goodness and the respect and the honor that God has built into our very souls, will in time win the day. I believe that we will find a way through the current firestorm of anger and judgment and pain. I believe that God is not quite done with us yet. And I believe that the Spirit of God will inspire, in time, the gift of community that has always characterized the "Communion of Saints" both living and dead, and God's hope for God's own people.

Until that time, may we continue to press and click together the pieces of our world that lie around our feet in a hot mess of colors and shapes and callings. And may we come to see the remarkable design that God has in store for us. It will not be a ball factory, obviously. But it will be something equally delightful. God promises us that, and a whole lot more.

Dear friends in Christ,

Have certain words changed meaning for you?

From the Director of Music

Music Ministry in a Time of Airborne Pandemic

If you saw the article in the July Herald about music in the church, you may be wondering a little about what music ministry at St. Peter's may look like. For a realistic, science-backed take on this reality take a look at <u>this article from the New York Times</u>. Since singing together inside is one of the easiest ways to spread the virus, we will simply come up with other ways to engage in music ministry for the time being. Here are some of my hopes.



We can use this time to grow inwardly. Through personal study of the psalms, hymn texts, and other songs, we may gain new insights into how God is working in our world. These insights may spur us to ever deeper love for our neighbors, particularly those who have been marginalized.

We can use this time to continue to develop musical and artistic skills in response to God's free gift of grace. I am planning to offer a class on church music fundamentals. We will gather via zoom and using hymns, we'll explore topics such as reading music, basic vocal technique, and how music ministry shapes our faith. I'm also planning to offer a book study or two which will explore ideas about church, worship, and church music.

We can use this time to make music in our homes. Just because we can't sing together, doesn't mean we have to stop singing. By taking home a hymnal from the church you can continue to praise God with singing hymns. We can sing together via Zoom meetings, or you can just sing whenever you want! Make a habit of singing a song each morning when you wake up, or each night before going to bed. Singing can be a chance to express yourself, ingest words of peace, or digest what happened during your day. Make use of it as a tool to brighten your existence!

Church music may look a little different for a while, but that doesn't mean it has to stop. Let's view this as a time of grand experiment. We may not always like what we end up with, but the journey of exploration may allow us to see a side of God that until now had been hidden to us. Peace to you and your families and keep the song going.


