Adult Christian Education



September: National Recovery Month 2020



Every September, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) sponsors *Recovery Month*, to increase awareness and understanding of mental and substance use disorders and celebrate the people who recover. There are millions of Americans who are in recovery, reminding us that treatment is effective and people can and do recover. *Recovery Month* also helps to reduce the stigma and misconceptions of the public's

understanding of mental health and substance use disorders, potentially discouraging anyone from seeking help. *Recovery Month* celebrates the gains made by those in recovery, just as we celebrate improvements made by those who are managing other health conditions such as hypertension, diabetes, asthma, and heart disease.

We want to help increase awareness and further a greater understanding about the diseases of mental and substance use disorders. It should not be surprising that during this COVID-19 pandemic, there has been an increase in visits to discuss mental health conditions such as anxiety and depression, as well as an increase drug and alcohol use and abuse. The fact is: anyone can experience mental health or drug/alcohol problems, and should not be afraid to reach out to their healthcare provider for help. We are among many who are experiencing these problems. Be supportive and help guide them. The good news is there are a number of treatment options that can be discussed and that help. Don't be afraid – reach out – stay well.

DID YOU KNOW...... The Prayer Chain is always looking for folks to join us? We are one of the few committees at church where almost all your committee "work" is done when it suits your schedule. St. Peter's Archives



Thanks to Lancaster Newspapers, Inc. we are now able to share interesting items about our church that have appeared in our local newspapers since the 1800s. These *archived* news items are a window into life in the late 19th century and early 20th century. Daily life was quite different and even challenging when St. Peter's first modest frame church was dedicated in 1880. The original site is located in our church cemetery, off Valley Road, Neffsville, and is marked with a sign. (see photo) Today, we take for granted all of the conveniences we enjoy. Did you know that the telephone was introduced in 1876, the lightbulb in 1878, toilet paper in 1880, the zipper in 1893, and the first automobile in 1889? Ford developed the Model T in 1908. Accidents and disease such as typhoid, cholera and smallpox were common in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The average life span in 1880 was about 40+ years which is unimaginable today! Indoor plumbing was in-

troduced in the late 19th century and greatly helped to reduce disease and extended life spans. The church was central to "family life" in the 19th and early 20th centuries. Please keep watching your monthly HERALD for archived items on life at St. Peter's during the last 140 years.

Pastor's Letter

"Different, but same ..."
--Mr. Miyagi, Karate Kid (1984)

Dear Friends:

As Mr. Miyagi studies a picture of his protégé, Daniel-san, with his girlfriend, in the original movie version of <u>The Karate Kid</u>, he pronounces his assessment of the two of them together ... "*Different, but same*." You could say the same thing about fall worship as it starts to grow on the horizon.

There will be much that is different, no doubt. We will most likely still be worshiping and learning through virtual platforms, as we continue to embrace the wisdom and counsel of most respected medical advisors, who suggest that inperson gatherings in enclosed spaces are not advised. We expect to be worshipping both through our continually evolving live stream worship experience, and in our in-person parking lot worship experiences, that will be offered starting on August 30th.

The vast majority of our meetings are still occurring through the Zoom platform, and phone calls and emails have tripled in volume, as we strive to stay connected, without running the risk of passing along the Covid virus to others by meeting in person. Our website has become our primary communication vehicle, with email and FB postings running a close second. We are doing some selected mailings, when we need to make sure we reach those who may not have internet access, but without a volunteer corps of persons to collate the 100's of collated pages in newsletters, the task can become challenging if it is used too often.

We miss seeing people face to face ... we miss singing ... we miss our beloved Coffee bar ... we miss arguing in person about theological minutiae in the Conference Room and Café and Room 100 ... we miss sharing the peace ... we miss singing the liturgy ... we miss our normal practices around the meal of Holy Communion.

But ... and it's a heavy BUT ... we are still the people of God, gathered in community to worship ... we are still "Building a community of faith by God's grace" as we live out our mission statement ... we are still "showing our love for God, our love for neighbors, and our desire to make disciples", as our vision statement directs us. We are still the people of God ... in this place ... at this time of life ... for the purpose of service to God and celebrate God's many blessings in our world, whether it is label with the adjective "COVID" or not.

So ... yes, things are different around the church, and how we do ministry is different ... and how we worship is different ... and how we learn and serve and fellowship is different. But a stinkin' virus cannot take from us the essence of who we are – children of God, called to serve in God's name. So, go ahead and have a pity-party for a few minutes. Feel free to indulge all the whining and complaining that accompanies these kinds or morose expressions of hopelessness (I certainly do, at times). And then open your eyes to what is still a beautiful world, and a powerful call to ministry, and an opportunity to make a difference in the lives of God's children.

It is what God has called us to do. It is what fills our lives with purpose. It is what keeps us connected to the heart of Jesus. In a "different" way, but "the same" way, too. Kudos to you, Mr. Miyagi.

Pastor Sarah's Message

Dear friends in Christ,

The other day I heard how one of our college-age members was able to respond quickly to an unforeseen event. He was taking a summer course and was in the midst of taking his online class final when the internet at his house went down. He was only a few answers from finishing this final, and the internet went down! That's where we simple mortals would simply look up to the heavens and yell, "WHY?!"

But as his mom was retelling the story, she simply said, "He pivoted." She smiled and explained how he created a hotspot on his phone, reconnected to the internet and completed the very important school final. Way to go! Way to pivot.

This word, "pivot," has seen an increase in usage these last six months. I've heard newscasters, superintendents, mayors, and bishops all use this word. You've experienced this word first hand.

Other words that have increased in their usage include "flex" and "hybrid." A few years ago, if you used the word pivot, I would have thought you were talking about basketball, and if you used the words flex and hybrid, I would have thought you were talking about a car made by Ford.

But these words describe our reality. We can use these words in describing the upcoming school year, the way we make plans, and the way we live out our faith.

In years past, the church staff would have had the entire year mapped out on our calendar. Currently, we humbly map out a few weeks, knowing that we may need to pivot, we may need to be flexible, and we may need to approach worship, learning, gathering and serving in hybrid ways.

But friends, some things never change.

Ministry continues. We worship the living God. Each week, God reaches out to us through forgiveness, words, songs, and hope. Each week you and I get to be blessed by our Lord and Savior!

Plans continue. Our Strategic Planning Committee is busy at work—creating a plan of how God is calling us into the future, and the resources we may need to heed God's call. Keep their work in your prayers as the Holy Spirit guides them.

Faith continues. Every week I get to hear stories of how you share God's love with each other, and how you witness to God's work in the world.

God's love continues. "This is God, our God forever and ever. God will be our guide forever." -Psalm 48:14

In any of the pivots you need to take in the days, weeks, and months ahead, may you feel God's guiding presence, and may you feel your family of faith around you as we continue "building a community of faith by God's grace."






Portals of Prayer


