Progressive Christmas Eve Service Christmas Eve 3:00 - 6:00 p.m.



You are invited to be part of our Progressive Christmas Eve Christmas Eve, the worship staff members have created a worship opportunity that allows us to safely gather in person and sing. service! In response to concerns of safely gathering this

St. Peter's will host its first ever Progressive Christmas Eve Service on December 24th from 3:00-6:00 p.m. Family groups (Covid pods) will gather in the memorial garden at the north end of the building, and progress to different stations in the church building to share in the story of the Christ child. Groups will progress through the Family Life Center, playground courtyard, and sanctuary before exiting the building on the south side under the carport. At each of these locations, worshipers will experience the Christmas story, sing beloved songs outside in safe ways, celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion, and take part in a candlelight singing of Silent Night.

Family groups *must* pre-register for a starting timeslot. Look for more information on how to do that in the coming weeks. Each group will progress at regular intervals

through the church while wearing masks. Each station will be timed such that groups will not overlap or bunch up allowing for everyone to participate but in a way that minimizes risk.

At the memorial garden, in the playground courtyard, and under the car port on the south side of the building, we will be singing outside (with masks on) to share the message of the season through some of our much beloved Christmas songs. Hallways and rooms will be decorated for Christmas and luminaries will light our way to the true light of the world which shines in our darkness.

Living Puppets for Christmas

If you have been involved in the Christmas Eve Children's services in past years, you will understand the need to step away from our children's involvement in the Story Sermon we have been doing for decades. But Pastor Ross is hoping you might consider being part of a Zoom Living Puppet Christmas story this year. The plan would be to gather one night in the coming weeks in our homes, via Zoom, and re-enact the kind of children's Christmas story we typically enact. Your children can dress up as an animal, or shepherd or wise man, and they will have sounds or words to say that characterize their role. If you have been at an Easter family service in recent years, that is the kind of experience this will be ... just via Zoom. If we have enough interest, we'll give it a go. Pastor Ross is in conversation with the camel to see if he is available. The night we will tape will be Thursday, December 10 at 6:30 p.m. It shouldn't take us more than 30-40 minutes to do a run through and then a taping for real. We will circulate this through our digital platforms so the congregation can enjoy it, but no names will be associated with any of the children on the video. Health and Wellness Committee



Your level of stress is likely high right now, what with COVID and the holidays, it's understandable. What is most important though, is that you have a plan to help reduce that stress. Stress is a physical and emotional response to overwhelming responsibilities, events, and changes. When



you're faced with stress, hormones (chemicals in your body) may trigger changes in your body. For instance, your * Heart may pound * Blood pressure may rise *Stomach may become tense and * Muscles may tighten.

Stressors (the effects of stress) may include the following:

- Adapting to constant change and the fear of the unknown
- Worries about your finances and the economy
- Handling a major life event, such as loss of a job, or a job change, loss of a friend or relative. Even positive life changes, such as getting married or the birth of a child, can cause stress
- Juggling many roles and responsibilities

If you're often under stress, you need to learn to manage it. Stress can affect your well-being. Over time, you may show some of the symptoms listed below.

- Physical effects: frequent colds, headaches, trouble sleeping or trouble with digestion
- Mental effects: You may have trouble concentrating or remembering
- Emotional effects: You may feel anxious, depressed, angry, or irritable
- Behavioral effects: Too much stress may lead you to eat poorly, or turn to drugs/alcohol

Basic Stress Management Suggestions:

<u>Take a brisk walk</u> or do something else that is active. Regular physical activity is best for reducing stress. <u>Learn problem solving skills</u>. They can improve your ability to cope. (Information on the internet may help) <u>Learn relaxation and mindfulness skills</u>. These skills can help you to notice and manage the responses in your body that come with stress. Daily relaxation may protect you from some of the consequences of stress. <u>List what needs to get done</u>, make a plan to address the things, and do your best to stick to the plan. <u>Stress is often associated with negative thinking</u>. Focus your attention on positive thoughts.

You may be feeling the effects of stress if you are not making time for fun in your life. Plan to have regular, enjoyable activities, and see if this reduces your stress. Getting outside in nature, taking a deep breath and noticing God's beauty in the world can reset those stress hormones.

Lydia's closet-Extra Clothes to Transport



Lancaster New Era Archives December 23, 1985 3 Candlelight Rites Slated at St. Peter's

St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Lititz Pike and Delp Road, will celebrate Christmas Eve with three candlelight services at 5:30, 7:30 and 11 p.m. The congregational carol singing will be accompanied by brass instrumentalists. All three services will feature the gospel procession, candle lighting, and organ prelude. The family service at 5:30 p.m. will feature a children's cantata, "So Far to Bethlehem," presented by the Junior Choir. At 7:30 and 11 p.m. the senior choir will sing "Christ is Born" with Heidi Schutzler as soprano soloist, and "O Rejoice Ye Christians Gladly" by Bach. The Rev. Richard E. Geib will deliver the Christmas message at the 7:30 p.m. service. As members of the congregation light their candles the senior choir will sing "Softly the Stars are Shining" by Adolph Torovsky. The sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated during the 11 p.m. service. The Senior Choir will sing "Before the Marvel of this Night" by Carl Schalk, and the Communion meditation will be delivered by the vicar, Robert M. White.



Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends:

It is the time of the year when we find ourselves thinking of presents. Presents for our loved ones ... presents that we put under the Giving Tree in the narthex of our church ... presence – the presence of God becoming incarnate in the baby Jesus in a Christmas manger. It is a season in which we think about the blessings in our lives, and the call to share those blessings with others Oh wait! We're living in "Covid-world." We aren't able to do most of the things that we usually do in December to celebrate those blessings God has showered upon us but that does not mean that we do not have many things to be thankful for ... many things that communicate the presence of God to us. Here are a few that come to my mind.

I am thankful for the creative ways that so many of you have lived out the ministries that are part of your lives in "normal" times. Whether that creativity has expressed itself in a Drive Thru Cookie Walk ... or a video of a lesson you read for Sunday worship ... or digital Bible Study – your willingness to adapt to the environment that is available to us has been a blessing to your staff. I am thankful for the consistent way that you have continued to support the congregation and its ministries. Some of these ministries are "invisible" to the naked eye, when we are unable to serve meals to the needy in our community, or bring Holy Communion to our homebound members ... or pray with people

in the hospital – but you have found ways to approximate that service in new and different ways. I am thankful that many of you have rediscovered the blessing of a phone call, as you reach out to those that you no longer see in the narthex after church, or in meetings in our Conference Room, or in the Family Life Center at a congregational Palm Sunday breakfast. I am thankful for the sacrificial way that you have continued to financially support the ministry of St. Peter's ... from your support for a church staff that you mostly see through a Zoom screen, if at all ... to your support for worship services that gather the people of God through the blessing of Live Stream worship ... to your generosity expressed in support for our local and global benevolences. I am personally grateful for your patience with a church staff



that almost every week or two, finds itself recreating existing ministries in ways that can be adapted to a digital or socially distanced world. I am grateful for a significant number of church members who work on the front lines of the battle against the Covid virus, either as doctors or nurses in hospitals and doctor's offices, or as caregivers in nursing homes and hospice centers, or as aides, social workers and volunteers who minister directly to people in their homes, because their needs are more modest and practical. And I am especially thankful for your patience in refraining from in person worship that may put some of the vulnerable members of our congregation at risk. I miss in person worship as much, or more, than most of you. Worship and pastoral visitation are why I went into ministry, and why I am still in parish ministry. Few people want to be in worship more strongly than I do. But when we gather again in our sanctuary or Family Life Center worship space, it will be because we believe we can do so safely.

Yes, ironically, I am grateful for many things in this Covid-world in which we live. I am not always happy about the variety of restrictions that we face. But I am grateful for the way that our staff tirelessly strives to create new ways to embrace old routines that feed our faith lives. I am grateful for the support so many of you have offered for our attempts to adapt old ministries to new settings. I am grateful for the kind words you share through emails, cards and phone calls. I am grateful that Covid-19 has not destroyed our ability to be the people of God, nor destroyed the heart of who we are as God's children, in ministry for the good of the world.

I hope and pray that you can join me in my thankfulness ... not only in your Thanksgiving celebrations, different as they may be this year, but also in our preparation for the greatest gift that God has even given to the world ... the gift of his son in a manger, who would spend his life preparing for a second offering of life again on the Cross of Calvary.

Pastor Sarah's Message



O come o come Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here, until of the Son of God appear.

This Advent season is like no other I've experienced. I often look for the familiar markers of the season, but this year these markers look different.

For me, many of these guideposts of the season have been experienced in corporate worship and gathering. In our current reality, it would be unwise to use the same guideposts as we have in years past. We might feel a list lost, a lot fatigued, and emotionally vulnerable. In essence, we

just might feel like we're in exile from the familiar.

Oh what a time for us to call upon our Lord... we pilgrims who are captive to sickness and the fragility of life. Exile is not a great place to be.

And yet... The Advent song of old reminds us Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel, Shall come to thee, O Israel.

Emmanuel. "God with us."

God is with you reminding you that you are not alone, even when this season may feel so strange. This feeling of exile will not last.
