## The Lancaster Examiner - May 24, 1902

A very pretty wedding was solemnized in St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Neffsville on Tuesday evening at 8:00 o'clock when Mr. Harry J. Taylor of Altoona, was united in marriage with **Miss Mabel Irene Witmer** of Neffsville. The bride is the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. E. H. Witmer and was one of Neffsville's accomplished young ladies. She was always a worker in the above church and Sunday School and was a member of the choir. She was also a graduate of last year's class of the Millersville State Normal School. The church was beautifully decorated for the occasion with palms and potted plants and the ceremony was witnessed by a large number of persons. The bridal party entered the church to the strains of the wedding march from Lohengrin, played by Miss Ada Wechter, and made their exit to the strains of Mendelssohn's wedding march. After the ceremony, a reception followed at the home of the bride, at which several hundred invited guests were present. A room upstairs was devoted to the display of the presents to the bride, which were numerous, and contained many in cut glass and silver. The array was a most handsome one.

Is physical activity for everyone? YES!



# A Guide to Upcoming Ballot Questions

There are three proposed amendments to the Pennsylvania Constitution on the upcoming May 18 Primary Election ballot. The following primer was compiled to raise awareness of these proposed amendments and to explain their potential impact for our community and State if they are approved. Any registered voter, regardless of party affiliation or nonaffiliation, can vote on these ballot questions.

Two involve giving the Legislature more say and the governor less say in determining the extension or termination of disaster emergency declarations...If approved they become part of the state Constitution forever, regardless of who the governor is or which party controls the Legislature. The third would add a provision guaranteeing that one's rights under the law cannot be denied because of race or ethnicity. (The League of Women Voters of Central Delaware County, <u>Three questions on May 18 Primary Ballot | MyLO (lwv.org</u>))

#### **Ballot Question 1**

"Shall the Pennsylvania Constitution be amended to change existing law and increase the power of the General Assembly to unilaterally terminate or extend a disaster emergency declaration—and the powers of Commonwealth agencies to address the disaster regardless of its severity pursuant to that declaration—through passing a concurrent resolution by simple majority, thereby removing the existing check and balance of presenting a resolution to the Governor for approval or disapproval?"

A "yes" vote <u>supports</u> this constitutional amendment to allow the Pennsylvania General Assembly to pass a resolution by a simple majority to extend or terminate the governor's emergency declaration. The governor cannot veto this resolution.

A "no" vote <u>opposes</u> this constitutional amendment, meaning that the governor would continue to be allowed to veto resolutions terminating emergency declarations and a two-thirds legislative vote would be required to override the veto.

#### **Ballot Question 2**

"Shall the Pennsylvania Constitution be amended to change existing law so that: a disaster emergency declaration will expire automatically after 21 days, regardless of the severity of the emergency, unless the General Assembly takes action to extend the disaster emergency; the Governor may not declare a new disaster emergency to respond to the dangers facing the Commonwealth unless the General Assembly passes a concurrent resolution; the General Assembly enacts new laws for disaster management?"

A "yes" vote <u>supports</u> this constitutional amendment to limit the governor's emergency declaration to 21 days, unless the legislature votes on a resolution to extend the order and provide that the state legislature shall pass laws related to how disaster emergencies must be managed.

A "**no**" vote <u>opposes</u> this constitutional amendment, meaning the governor would continue to be allowed to issue emergency declarations without a legislative vote after 21 days.

#### **Ballot Question 3**

"Shall the Pennsylvania Constitution be amended by adding a new section providing that equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged because of an individual's race or ethnicity?"

A "yes" vote <u>supports</u> adding language to the state constitution that prohibits the denial or abridgement of rights on account of an individual's race or ethnicity.

A "no" vote <u>opposes</u> adding language to the state constitution that prohibits the denial or abridgement of rights on account of an individual's race or ethnicity.

# **Pastor's Letter**



Dear Friends:

This month you have two letters for the price of one!

**MISSION CAMPAIGN** – by now you have received two of three planned mailings from our Mission Campaign team. Our hope is that the information provided so far, has communicated to you the dual focus of this campaign – an outward call for mission partnerships in our local and global communities ... and also an inward call to strengthen our spiritual home here at 10 Delp Road; the place from which our local and global mission is shaped and supported through a safer and restored infrastructure and building.

You will soon be receiving a third mailing from your St. Peter's spiritual home, inviting you to accept for yourself an active and sacrificial share of making this mission

campaign come alive, through your generosity. We ask you to read and digest this final communique, as you no doubt have done with the first two. We ask you to pray for boldness in considering what level of giving is right for your household, hopefully in conversation with your family members about your dreams for this campaign. And we ask you to communicate with our Mission Team your intentions for financially supporting this campaign with a sacrificial gift using the commitment card that will be enclosed.

There is no doubt in my mind that we have the resources here to meet our campaign goal of \$1,250,000. There is little doubt in my mind that we can also meet our "stretch" goal of \$1,500,000. My dream is that we will exceed even this goal. The dollars that will be directed to our building and infrastructure are a fixed amount. Once the various projects are completed, that part of the campaign goal will be completed. But every dollar after that will go to ministries and missions, and the sky is the limit in terms of the mission needs that await us near and far.

I thank you ahead of time for your partnership in this continuing campaign endeavor, and I look forward to rejoicing with you when we meet and exceed both of our goal milestones.

**WORSHIP LIFE** – We find ourselves in the earliest of days of "Covid-life, Year 2" as I sometimes think of it. We have made it through twelve months of limited social contact, Zoom Overload, fear and anxiety around a biological enemy we cannot see with our eyes, and an increasing sense of fatigue because of our inability to live life communally in the ways we always have lived it. Although I rank somewhat high on the introversion spectrum, I do heavily rely on the visual and verbal cues I observe in groups of people. And those cues help me stay properly oriented to and connected with the communities of which I am a part. So Covid-life has created a significant spirit of disorientation in me. I feel like a ship without an anchor in our communal St. Peter's life.

I share this because I am as impatient as you are to get back into in-person worship in our wonderful sanctuary. While there is great satisfaction in leading live-stream worship from the sanctuary, it cannot hold a candle to being gathered with others, in person, in the spiritual discipline of worship and praise. I share this with you, because I want you to know that your leaders who are advising our church-wide practices in the realm of public gatherings, share that same spirit and desire to be together in our worship life. But as a team of staff, Risk Management, Worship and Congregation Council members, we are also committed to good and safe practice. We use metrics established by our local health leaders. We take seriously the advice and counsel of the bishop of our synod. We try to stay abreast of current changes in suggested best practice in the face of the virus. To be frank, these metrics and the research backing them, advise that large in-person, indoor gatherings are still risky. I recognize that some local churches have chosen to return to in-church public worship. Many have quite small congregations and believe they can do it safely. We find that to be an ill-advised choice for St. Peter's, in that when we shut down, we were averaging 350-400 people in worship.

Folks, we are on the downside of this period of Covid-isolation. The longest stretch of isolation is past. I encourage you to continue your support of your friends and fellow parishioners who have accepted the mantle of advising good practice in the midst of a pandemic. They act and lead in an attempt to keep us safe and intact as a community of faith. The Israelites wandered for forty years in exile ... without Zoom. We can manage the months remaining in this pandemic, thanks to the creativity of many in this community. I ask you to join us in this final stretch of life in worship diaspora.

# Pastor Sarah's Message



Dear friends in Christ,

A few years ago, St. Peter's adopted the mission statement "building a community of faith by God's grace." What an appropriate mission to have in the face of a pandemic that has turned the ways that we do community on its ear. And yet, by God's grace lived through and in you, we continue to live into this mission!

#### Power of Community

I have witnessed the power of community, and the revelation where two or three are gathered in Jesus' name, our Lord is present.

I've witnessed this power and presence when it's been 32 degrees outside and the Sunday School learning pod has gathered outdoors, because community trumps temperature. I've witnessed this power in small groups—whether you're in the church kitchen creating the next community meal for Grace Lutheran Downtown, or you're asking questions in a Bible study, or courageously being vulnerable with each other in a support group. I've witnessed the power of community when you faithfully check in with each other because you believe that when we care for each other we are never, ever alone. I've witnessed how pandemics have not kept you from dreaming about our church's future and the new and exciting ways that we can serve the Lord.

#### **Mission Campaign**

Can I tell you how I'm strangely grateful that we're doing a mission campaign in the midst of a pandemic? I know it's an odd thing to write, but I am grateful for the timing. The mission campaign in coordination with strategic planning has helped keep certain core principles of who we are in focus. We are church together and together we worship, we learn, we gather, and we serve in Jesus' name. As a community we've discerned needs that need to be addressed. Our five senses can point out some of the needs—especially when it comes to our physical church space. Our hearts and the Holy Spirit's call point to areas of ministry and mission that yearn for attention and support. This Mission Campaign helps to focus on a very important question: *who is God calling us to be in this post-pandemic future*?

Who is God calling us to be as God's people in this time?

This pandemic has caused a lot of anxiety and fear, and yet God is calling us to have faith in the future. God is calling us to lean into the power of community. And our Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ, is walking alongside us—guiding us, encouraging us, leading us, and loving us.

I truly give thanks for the ways that you have lived into our shared mission. I give thanks for your grit and your faithfulness. I give thanks for your compassion and love that you abundantly share. I give thanks for you, as we are companions together on this journey.

# From the Director of Music

#### Music Ministry at St. Peter's

Like many of you, I've had a lot of opportunities to think deeply about what I do over the last year. The ministry of music at St. Peter's has always been robust and full of life. Finally, this summer I'm embarking on a project to better catalogue the music in our library. We have a good catalogue to start, but it is centered on technology which by now is a couple of generations old. With a variety of newer tools on the market, taking the time to upgrade our database of music will make it easy as pie to find music to sing and ring that stretches our imaginations, proclaims the faith, and furthers the mission of the church.

So, I leave you asking you these questions: what parts of your faith life need to be cleaned up? What aspects of your devotional life need to be better organized? How can you work behind the scenes to make yourself a better servant to others?

# **Preschool Update:**

We have been working hard to prepare for the upcoming 2021/2022 preschool year. There have been a few changes:

- 1. Due to Covid, we are capping our classes at 12 students. We will have 2- 4/5 year old classes, 2 3 year old classes and 1 older 2/younger 3 year old class. We may be opening up a third 4/5 year old class. (Our school is almost full!)
- 2. Our times for preschool will be 9:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m.

#### We will be using our strategic plan for guidance with this ministry:

- 1. Seek to teach God's love through adult education, our programs for children and youth, and our preschool.
- We are offering a *Prayground* program after preschool. Our preschoolers will bring their lunch, have free play and learn the Biblical story.
- We are coordinating ministry events between the church and preschool such as our egg hunt, Santa breakfast, VBS and more.
- ♦ Utilize the rostered staff in educational opportunities for the preschoolers and their families.
- 2. Provide ministries opportunities for the entire family to be involved together.
- ◊ We will include our preschool families in these ministry opportunities
- 3. Connect families with children together, ideally through a small group or support structure.
- ♦ A possible future parenting group with the parents of these preschoolers.
- 4. Partner with established community programs that provide services to the local community.
- Our preschool will be working with the Ronald McDonald House and other area organizations. We are planning multiple service opportunities for the preschool children and their families for engagement.

#### 5. Partner with the local school district to identify needs in their district.

We are in contact with local school districts to identify low income children who could benefit from our preschool program. We are also in conversation with Head Start. – Sandy Hirko has established a scholarship program for low income students to help offset the cost of the preschool. We are accepting donations from parishioners who wish to contribute.

We are also cleaning out our preschool spaces and donating toys, books and other materials that are not needed. We have an abundance of these items and wish to bless other preschools or families who could benefit from these items. We are working with the school district and local service organizations that we hope can take advantage of these supplies. We are excited for the upcoming school year.
