# **Mission Campaign**

St. Peter's family,

As promised in our June note, we are pleased to share the good news of our campaign progress to-date!



#### **Campaign Progress**

As of mid-June when we submitted this article, 89 households had pledged or gifted their treasures, totaling \$889,640. Of that total, we have received \$206,800 funds-in-hand. Having received commitments that account for 70% of our base campaign goal within the first month of the campaign is reason to offer thanks and praise! We are off to a strong start, and we are grateful for your continued prayers and generosity. THANK YOU!

Our Kirby-Smith campaign consultants, Rachel and Richie Musser, are reaching out to the nearly 500 households who have not yet made a commitment to the campaign. The Mussers will continue their

outreach to the congregation throughout the summer months.

#### **Ongoing Communications**

And, as we stated last month, we are committed to providing monthly progress updates via our various church communication vehicles.

We hope you will continue to reach out to either of us, directly, with your questions and/or concerns. Both of us appreciate the many questions related to the alignment of this campaign and the approval and launch of the strategic plan. We are actively partnering with congregation Council leaders to ensure transparency and clarity to the strategic plan's impact on the campaign.

#### **Allocation of Campaign Funds Received**

We attended the June 14 Council meeting to provide a campaign update and propose a process for expending the cash received. We are grateful to Council for approving the approach, so that campaign dollars received are put to good use quickly. Prior to the launch of the campaign, in a show of faith, Council approved expenditures totaling \$180,000 to address several of our immediate facilities needs, including replacement of the rooftop heat pump units, installment of a new boiler, and replacing the control system. We asked that Council allocate \$180,000 of the campaign funds received to the general fund as "reimbursement" for the advance spend.

The next \$425,000 of cash received will be directed to the remaining church property needs outlined in our campaign materials. Thereafter, and until the base campaign goal is reached, received funds will be proportionally distributed between debt reduction and the mission fund. The two of us will liaise between Norm Yunginger, who is expertly leading the conservation/gift recording part of the campaign, and Council, offering recommendations as to where/when funds should be distributed. As campaign co-chairs, we are also members of the Finance Committee, which provides another key connection point. We will continue to communicate when and how campaign dollars are used.

#### **Mission Fund**

We are absolutely delighted that Council formally approved the concept of a Mission Fund Advisory Board, the body that will recommend to Council how mission funds raised through this campaign will be allocated. We each bring experience in creating and engaging in such advisory boards, and we will be drafting the necessary charter, policies, and decision-making processes to provide to Council for their review and approval. We know there is a strong desire to understand how we would operationalize a Mission Fund, and the "meat" will be on the "bones" of this concept very soon. Suffice it to say, we are confident that the results will be a shot in the arm to the outward-facing missions of St. Peter's and the opportunities that all of us have to participate in advancing ministry. We're happy to be partnering with Council to commence this important planning work.

Thank you for your continued prayers and your discernment of the treasures God calls you to provide to help St. Peter's grow into the future. We look forward to seeing you at church!

# **Local Social Ministry Corner**

This month we will focus on our Community Meal Ministry. St Peter's Community Meal Ministry cooks meals and serves them at Grace Lutheran. Pre-COVID the team was able to serve them indoors in Grace's dining room area. #### SANCTUARY LIGHT BULB REPLACEMENT...CONTINUED



In my last article I told you about sanctuary lamp bulbs being replaced using a mechanical lift. Well, next time you enter the sanctuary, look up and you will see MANY lamps lighting the sanctuary. Some are replaced using a special lift BUT many more can only be changed from above.

This month I joined octogenarian, George Groff (who can still climb like a child on the play-ground), in the rafters above the sanctuary changing lamps that had burned out. Rich Larrick of the Property Committee has been doing this for many years but was not available this year. The photos below give you a picture of what it looks like above you and how difficult it is to crawl over and under the roof rafters and even over heating/cooling ducts to get to each lamp. he and I communicated by walkie-talkie as George and I searched for the burned-out bulbs. Thankfully it was a cool day!

# **Health & Wellness**

#### **JULY: NATIONAL BLUEBERRY MONTH**

National Blueberry Month is an annual observation during the entire month of July. This once wild berry became domesticated during the early 1900s. Before this, wild blueberries were never successfully transplanted and raised in any farming operation for personal or commercial produc-

tion. The only way to enjoy fresh blueberries was to seek them out where they grew naturally! National Blueberry Month has been officially recognized by the United States Department of Agriculture since being founded in 2003.

**So why is your Health & Wellness Committee talking about blueberries?** Well, these vibrant berries pack a punch in vitamins and health benefits. They have antioxidants and phytoflavinoids, and are also high in potassium and vitamin C. This makes them a top dietary choice of doctors and nutritionists. Not only can they lower your risk of heart disease and cancer, they are also anti-inflammatory. "Inflammation is a key driver of all chronic diseases, so blueberries have a host of benefits," says Ann Kulze, MD, of Charleston, S.C., author of *Dr. Ann's 10 Step Diet: A Simple Plan for Permanent Weight Loss and Lifelong Vitality.* When selecting berries, note that the darker they are, the more antioxidants they have. Kulz also strongly suggests: "....have a serving (about 1/2 cup) every day, and frozen are just as good as fresh." Blueberries make a great snack all on their own, or enhance a meal. They also make stellar desserts or sauces.

So, enjoy some fresh blueberries! They're in season, and they are ripe for the picking!

# Rev. Craig A. Ross elected St. Peter Lutheran co-pastor February 4, 1994 - Lancaster New Era

The Rev. Craig A. Ross has been elected co-pastor of St. Peter's Lutheran Church, at Lititz Pike and Delp Road. Ross and the Rev. Richard E. Geib will serve as the church's co-pastors during 1994. Geib plans to retire at the end of the year, and Ross will become the Senior Pastor at that time. When Geib retires he will have served more than 20 years at St. Peter's. Ross began serving as assistant pastor in 1986 and was later named associate pastor. He was the pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church, Hoernerstown from 1983 to 1986. A native of North Babylon, New York, Ross is a graduate of Furman University and Lutheran Theological Seminary, Gettysburg.

# Summer Worship Schedule

As we continue to move toward the fall, St. Peter's is gradually stepping toward a regular worship life together. On July 4<sup>th</sup> we will adjust our worship service offerings to this schedule:

8:00 – Indoor service with traditional music

9:45 – Indoor service with traditional music, also livestreamed for at-home worshippers

11:00 – Outdoor service with rotating leadership

July 4 – New Day

July 11 – Traditional with choir

July 18 – Traditional

July 25 – Family service

#### **Indoor Service Additions**

This month we add a second congregational sung hymn and start to add in pieces of our sung liturgy. We are moving cautiously but are optimistic about the continued low case metrics. As we approach August and September we will continue to add in pieces of music. The worship staff and altar guild are also determining best practices around communion distribution as we move toward the fall. It is our intent to be back to a worship schedule by September that resembles what we have had in the past.

# **Church Mask Policy Update**

As the mask mandate for PA lifts, our church mask policy updates as well. Keeping in line with the authorities (CDC, Department of Health, Department of Education) we have been relying on throughout the pandemic, St. Peter's recommends we follow the CDC guidelines. Those who are fully vaccinated need not wear masks; those who have not been fully vaccinated should wear masks. Per the CDC recommendations regarding being in groups with mixed vaccination status, WHEN WE SING DURING WORSHIP, we ask that **all** wear masks, to help protect those among us who cannot yet get vaccinated (children younger than 12, immunocompromised, etc.). **We will continue to evaluate this policy as we approach the fall.**

# Pastor's Letter

Hi Folks:

So ... we are almost a month into our return to in-person worship. The overall strategy we have adopted throughout the pandemic, has been to proceed with some caution, safely and gradually restoring the variety of ministries and activities that place us in close proximity to each other. We have amended and revised some ministries, while keeping others in much the same format as they existed in pre-pandemic days. We have been grateful for your patience ... understanding of your frustrations when you thought we weren't moving quickly enough, or too quickly ... and pleased with your ability to adapt and adjust when circumstances required it. This has been a good test of the mettle of our community of faith.

Starting in July on the 4<sup>th</sup>, we will add our second in-person worship service at 9:45 a.m. Thus our Sunday mornings will be back to normal in terms of our sanctuary worship times of 8:00 & 9:45 a.m., along with the added bonus of our rotating schedule of 11:00 a.m. outdoor worship services, **and** a live-stream experience that will become an actual "live stream" of one of our indoor worship services. If you have been to any of the 8:00 a.m. in-person gatherings, you have experienced our gradual re-introduction of parts of the worship service. We have been the most careful in expanding our worship life in regards to music, so as to make sure we are proceeding using safe practice. Our 8:00 a.m. services have been well attended thus far, and we look forward to welcoming back those of you who simply prefer a bit later start to your sabbath observance.

Although we are not up to full speed yet in terms of our in-person gatherings, we will continue to grow into what should be pretty close to whatever the "new normal" will be in the world in which we currently live. On behalf of our staff and lay leaders who have accepted the mantle of deliberation and decision-making for virtually every activity that has involved people gathering together, I thank you. Whether you have felt yourself to be patient with the process or impatient ... whether you envisioned yourself as a critic or supporter of various choices and actions ... whether you thought we moved too quickly or too slowly ... you have been here with us throughout these past fifteen months. Maybe you were actively engaging decisions and choices, or not. Maybe you were vocal, or silent. Maybe you engaged in discussions with friends and neighbors, or kept your thoughts to yourself. Community is typically most healthy when it has diverse and unique opinions and perspectives that can be voiced in love and concern without being divisive. That has been the case here for the most part.

So I pray that in the coming weeks of summer, you will either continue your engagement of the worship, service, fellowship and learning activities available in our community of faith ... or that you will consider anew, where your time, talents and passions may best find expression in our community of faith. We are always better when your gifts and talents and passions are invested in our congregational life.

# Pastor Sarah's Message

Dear friends in Christ,

I wanted to share with you a few reflections from these past few weeks—and how exciting they are as we are entering into a new chapter of our life together building a community of faith by God's grace.

The first reflection is worship, because our lives together are grounded in worship. On June 6<sup>th</sup> I was able to worship with many of you in the sanctuary. I was delighted to see you in the flesh! During our 8:00 a.m. service, Pastor Craig took the lead in worship, so I could sit in the pews and worship. I knew that I would be affected by seeing so many of you, but I hadn't anticipated the impact of hearing you, when we as a congregation began the words of the Apostles' Creed.

For so many months, Pastor Craig, Sister Dottie and I have been leading the creed in a solitary fashion. Those first words, "I believe in God..." when spoken by just one person does lift up one's own individual experience of faith. And yet on the 6<sup>th</sup>, to hear you join me in speaking those words, "I believe in God..." it is hard for me to even put words to paper as to how impactful that experience was for me. To know that we are truly church together, to hear siblings in Christ gathered for the same faith, the same mission of Jesus Christ. What a beautiful thing! I invite you, the next time I get to see you at worship in the sanctuary, to just take a moment and hear your brothers and sisters in Christ share this faith alongside you.

The second reflection is also worship, and that happened a little later in the morning, on June 6<sup>th</sup> when I was able to lead the outdoor worship service with the New Day band. I hadn't heard the band play together since March 2020, and you wouldn't have known that they had been on such a long hiatus given the way they faithfully and beautifully played as they gave glory to God through their music. And it was so good to see so many of your faces, and to hear you sing, and be able to enjoy each other. What a beautiful thing to do. Even if that day it was 95 degrees!

My third reflection is on the activities that we get to reinstate in our lives. We got to have family visit (from several states away!). My daughter was able to go to summer day camp at Camp Kirchenwald. Erik and I were able to have a date night, and eat dinner, in a restaurant! Last year none of these things could have happened. Like many of us, there are a lot more things that we get to do now that were just not an option for us then.

I hope that this summer you are able to reinstate beloved traditions, visit beloved people, and join me in turning the page of our story as we enter into a new chapter of life together.

If someone has yet to invite you to church, please consider this invitation! I would love to worship with you, to pray with you, and to hear what new chapters you are beginning.

May God bless you as you renew and try new experiences in the days ahead.

# From the Director of Music

#### Health and Well-being

We're a month into our worship plans for the summer. I have so very much enjoyed getting to see everyone, to worship together, and to finally hear your voices raised in song together. The emotions run deep as we gather and I'm so grateful for the chances we are getting to praise God and share the good news of Jesus Christ. Of course, we're not done yet. There are more steps to take until we get back to our typical, pre-pandemic worship services. The worship

staff have been talking about the logic behind stepping back into worship together and I thought I'd share them here.

First, the pandemic made a lot of us reexamine our commitments. Personally speaking, last year I suddenly had more time on my hands and I found that it wasn't always a bad thing. I was able to engage with my family more, to engage with my own personal hobbies, and to really think about what activities sparked joy. As we gather back together, we have heard from some who are excited to get back to serving in church because it brings you joy. We've also heard from some who realized they were overtaxed and that stepping away from some aspects of service was a hidden blessing. Both of these responses are valid and good to hear! Serving is meant to be an act based in joy and as a response to the saving message of Jesus' death and resurrection. Stepping our worship practices in gradually has allowed our various groups associated with worship to get their bearings, evaluate, and move forward from a place of physical, mental, and emotional health.

By stepping in some of our actual worship practices we also have a chance to observe how our actions may be affecting the health of our community. We began by gathering together indoors and saw this was safe. We added singing one song together and we continue to see that this is safe. We'll add more indoor gatherings and more songs with the expectation that our community will remain safe. In this same way we will continue to step in practices such as communion distribution, passing offering plates, and so on. This journey allows us to evaluate, work together with the lay worship leadership, and make decisions that progress toward our goal of gathering fully.

Our goal throughout this pandemic has been to keep the health and well-being of our community at the forefront of all decisions regarding worship. I count the lack of an outbreak associated with St. Peter's a huge success for our community and we have all of you to thank for that. It hasn't been easy, and we haven't always agreed about methods, but your commitment, patience, and love for one another saved lives. And for that, I say, "Thanks be to God!"
