Mission Campaign



St. Peter's family,

We are delighted to report that as of mid-August, 100 households have pledged treasures totaling \$917,780. Of that total, we have received \$302,411 to put to work! Thank you for your pledges and gifts. These commitments already have us at 73% of our base campaign goal! This has been a very strong start to the campaign, but more work lies ahead!

If you have not yet made your commitment, please access the pledge form on our website at www.stpeterslutheran.org/mission-campaign/ and return it to the church office. As Chairs of the campaign, both of us are willing to speak with you, confidentially, if it will help you discern your interests and commitment to the campaign. Please reach out and let us know how we can be of service!

Church Council has allocated \$280,000 of the funds received, thus far, to various church property projects, including repayment to the operating fund for replacement of the boiler/controller/heat pump, deposit to secure the estimate to repair the parking lot in spring 2022, furnishings for the narthex, and repairs in two Sunday School rooms. You should begin seeing progress on several of these in the coming weeks. We'll continue to use this Herald column, the church website, and other communication means to keep you informed of these and other Mission Campaign successes.

Over the last week, we have spoken with many who expressed concern over how Pastor Sarah's decision to leave St. Peter's may impact the campaign. We are exceptionally confident that Pastor Sarah's departure will not slow the Campaign or the strategic initiatives the Campaign is designed to fund. In fact, the timing of these events provides a fresh opportunity to refocus on the first objective of the Strategic Vision Plan: Leadership Succession. We see great alignment among the implementation of the Strategic Vision Plan, continuation of the Mission Campaign, and the launch of a call process in the fall.

Thank you for your continued prayer for the Campaign, as well as your discernment surrounding a personal commitment to support St. Peter's growth and ministry enhancement, both near and far. Please continue to reach out to either of us, directly, with any questions or concerns. We appreciate hearing from you!

Fall Worship Schedule

Indoor Traditional Services

Beginning September 5th traditional services return to the 8:00 and 10:45 worship schedule, making room for a Sunday School hour between them. Services include readings, a sermon, prayers, and congregationally sung music as well as special music from St. Peter's ensembles.

Prayer Chain Ministry

DID YOU KNOW your Prayer Chain has an Ongoing List of about 50 petitions? More than half of those requests have been on this list over six years! When the prayer chain began almost 20 years ago, there was no email, no online requests and no Ongoing List. As technology improved and the chain grew, so did our requests. (For those that don't know, our Ongoing List is a list of petitions



that we pray for daily, in addition to the daily requests we receive and our own personal prayers.) After many discussions between the leaders and Pastor Ross over the past few years, we have made the decision to reorganize the Ongoing List to a more manageable size. Beginning October 1st, all ongoing requests are for one month. Submitters are welcome to resubmit requests as needed. All ongoing requests received before January 1, 2021 have been removed from the list.. All requests received in 2021 will be our "current" Ongoing List until September 30th. Beginning October 1st, those requests will be removed and we will begin our new and more manageable list.

Pastor Sarah's Message

Dear friends in Christ,

On August 1st I celebrated my 11th year of ordination in the roster of word and sacrament in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, and I give thanks that I have been able to serve as one of your pastors at St. Peter's for 7 of those years. These years have been a privilege: preaching the gospel and sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with you; celebrating communion; baptizing blessing affirmations of baptism through confirmation and through new membership classes; talking with you about faith and facilitating Christian education classes, visiting with you in your home, at the hospital and in rehab centers; and walking with you when we commended a loved one to our Lord's eternal care.

I wanted to share a bit of my discernment journey with you as I begin the process of saying farewell as your Pastor of Christian Formation.

A few years ago, church leadership started to look with eyes of faith to what the next five, ten, fifteen years might look like in the mission and ministry of St. Peter's. And, thus began my discernment journey exploring my call to congregational ministry, and specifically, my call as one of the pastors at St. Peter's.

A 2017-19 fellowship with the Clergy Leadership Program of Central Pennsylvania through Messiah College allowed me to deepen my understanding of the pastoral role in the context of congregation and the wider community and to connect with a spiritual director who has walked with me in my discernment process.

During this period of time, I was trying to parse a feeling to a variety of calls — call to the ministry I love, call to the needs of the wider church, and also the call to my family. Since the beginning of 2020, there have been some shifting needs in my nuclear and extended family circles. Over the last year I have been in prayer and conversation with family, spiritual directors, and colleagues about my discernment journey.

In the spring of 2021 after prayerful discernment with my family and spiritual director, I came to the conclusion that in this season of my life, I am feeling called to serve the wider church in a non-congregational setting.

In the beginning of June, I shared with Pastor Craig my intent to end my call as pastor at St. Peter's. We began discussing what a transition may look like. Considering the potential impact of a pastoral transition on our mission campaign and strategic planning work, Pastor Craig and I alerted Richie Musser, our campaign consultant, to my decision.

Several weeks after learning of my intent to leave St. Peter's, Kirby-Smith Associates invited me to discern the opportunity of joining them in helping churches, religious institutions, and non-profits raise and steward funds in service to the Lord.

As I prayed about this opportunity, I was reminded of the ways that God has guided me toward this work. During my internship (vicar year) I served at Christus Victor in Naples, FL and was part of their capital campaign team. During my first call in Perrysburg, OH I helped the Northwestern Ohio Synod with an appeal to raise funds for ministries in need. In my call to St. Peter's, I have loved helping out with the Mission Campaign.

This work in serving the wider church with Kirby-Smith would touch upon my passion toward communication, steward-ship, and connecting people to a common vision in love of neighbor and service to our Lord. Through this discernment, my next calling became clear. And, after Pastor Craig returned from his vacation, I shared my plan to leave St. Peter's in early October.

With an ocean of emotion, I say goodbye as one of your rostered leaders, and pray that God continues to guide you and this congregation as you continue in building a community of faith by God's grace. I ask for your prayers, as well, as I continue on my journey.

To quote the lyrics from a beloved hymn, God be with you till we meet again.

Families of our Children and Youth

Our rostered staff have been discussing and planning our 2021/2022 Christian Education year. We have been mindful as well of the increasing numbers of cases due to the Delta variant with Covid-19.

Due to the increase of cases and the knowledge that the majority of our children and youth are unable to be vaccinated, we have decided to hold Sunday school outdoors for grades PreK thru grade 8. Most of our older youth have already been vaccinated. While we realize most of our children and youth will be attending school in person, we want to see if there are outbreaks in school and if cases will increase or decrease in early fall. We believe this is a worthwhile endeavor to keep our children and unvaccinated population safe at this time.

Sunday morning will look a bit different in the fall as well. In addition to our indoor traditional worship services at 8:00 and 10:45 a.m. and our 10:45 a.m. New Day service, we will be offering an **outdoor family service at 9:00** a.m. on the north side of the building near the memorial garden. The service will last 30 minutes with Sunday school for children and adults beginning immediately after the worship service. If your family chooses not to attend worship, SS will begin at 9:30 a.m. and run until 10:15 a.m.

There will be two adult Sunday School offerings, one will be held indoors in the conference room and the other class will meet outdoors.

We are requesting that children and adults please wear masks while indoors on Sunday. We will continue to revisit proper protocol to keep everyone safe during this current wave of the virus. Children and adults who are meeting outdoors will not be required to wear a mask.

In the event of inclement weather, we will move Sunday school indoors and masks will be necessary.

We are also looking for parents to help lead our Sunday school lessons for grades preK thru grade 4 – curriculum and all materials are provided and you can do as little or as many Sundays as you are able. We are hoping to spread out the work to be able to give some of our teachers a break so they too can attend some adult SS classes.

St. Peter's Preschool Prepares To Reopen

When St. Peter's Preschool, 10 Delp Road, Lancaster, shut down in accordance with COVID-19 restrictions in March of 2020, teachers left their classrooms and did not return until the summer of 2021. Until the teachers were able to begin to prepare for the school's reopening on Monday, Sept. 13, calendars, lists of student names, and seasonal classroom decorations remained locked in time.

•Now, all that is changing, as teachers and Heather Cramer, St. Peter's Preschool director, work to get ready for the arrival of new students. Cramer anticipates a few changes when the parents line up cars to drop off the children on the first day. "We will be a bit smaller than in the past to give a little more social distance for children," said Cramer, who has reduced class size from 16 students to 12 with a teacher and assistant. There will be a class for young 3-year-olds meeting three days a week and classes for 4- and 5-year-olds that meet five days a week with an option for four days a week. Classes will meet from 9 a.m. to noon each weekday.

In addition to classrooms, children will have scheduled access to a courtyard playground outfitted with a variety of equipment and a material on the ground that facilitates soft landings. A gym area provides bikes, hula hoops, and other types of indoor play equipment. One of the classrooms has been turned into a children's library that students can visit. It also provides waiting space for parents who visit. Cramer has decorated the area with characters from children's books such as "The Very Hungry Caterpillar."

When some teachers retired at the advent of COVID-19 restrictions, they chose to donate educational resources to St. Peter's. "They left toys, games, and puzzles," noted Cramer. "We had what we needed for classes, so we offered gently used toys to Milagro House, (Gaudenzia) Vantage House (and others)." In addition, toys were donated to Miracle Center Fellowship, a nondenominational place of worship in Mount Joy that used the items to set up a Sunday school program and vacation Bible camp.

Another change is an extended lunch program, which will meet on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. "(Students) will have the option of signing up for Prayground," said Cramer, who said that this activity will be led by either herself or Sister Dottie Almoney, director of education and outreach for St. Peter's Evangelical Lutheran Church, which oversees the preschool ministry. "There will be a Bible lesson or music or cooking or a science experiment - something they didn't do in the morning," explained Cramer.

Cramer, who has early childhood and elementary education degrees from Millersville University, has contacted her alma mater about helping students with observation experience. "(Millersville) students could read a story, observe, or do a lesson plan," she said. "They could come in for that experience."


