# **Annual Meeting - November 13**



This year's Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, November 13 at 10:15 a.m. in the Sanctuary. We will worship in a modified fashion at 9:00 a.m. in the sanctuary with both 8:00 & 10:30 AM worshippers in attendance and at 9:00 a.m. in the Family Life NGREGATIONAL Center for an earlier gathering of our New Day congregation. Following worship, we will gather in the sanctuary for the Annual

Meeting at 10:15 a.m. A children and youth activity will be offered for all nonconfirmed youth in the Youth Lounge during the meeting. Confirmed youth can vote in the proceeding, so we hope they will be with us in the meeting. The Coffee Bar will be open and active prior to the meeting.

At this year's meeting we will conduct typical business such as approving the 2023 budget, electing congregational officers and council members, and receiving a few reports from some congregational committees and leaders. We will hear an update on the mission campaign. There will also be a ratification vote on the constitutional changes we have been working on for the past couple of years. A brief update on the call process will also be offered. You should be here for three reasons: (1) You should know how your congregation is being managed by your staff and fellow members; (2) It is your responsibility to take ownership for these items which are entrusted into the hands of the congregation gathered at this meeting; (3) We need a quorum to conduct business. 


# **Thanksgiving Break**

### **Communion Assistants Needed**



# **Stewardship**



The Tanzania Mission Committee (TMC) evolved out of our 2006 Vicar Greg Lindsay's Vicar Project to connect St. Peter's to the newly formed relationship between the Lower Susquehanna Synod and the Konde Dioceses in Southwest Tanzania. The Busoka Lutheran Church, located in a rural area of the Konde Dioceses, was partnered with St. Peter's to form companion congregations. Vicar Greg and our Parishioner Laretta Stutzman visited the Konde Dioceses and Busoka in 2006 to personalize our relationship and began our now 16-year journey together.

"In Busoka, Vicar Greg and Laretta found the worst poverty they had ever seen and met an indigent but joyful, spiritual people, full of life and love. With only God, their families, the land, and their meager belongings, they were happy. And the only thing they asked of St. Peter's was to pray for them."

The HIV/AIDS virus was ravaging much of Africa resulting in Busoka having over 100 orphans due to the virus. Helping the orphans became the centerpiece of our relationship with Busoka. The orphan population has varied between about 55 to 150 since our relationship started.

Now 16 years later, thru the generosity of the parishioners of St. Peter's, we have sent almost \$200,000 thru the Konde Dioceses to Busoka. These funds help clothe, feed, and educate the orphans, support the Busoka people and are now helping fund the construction of their new church building.

Judy Wenrich chaired the TMC from January 2007 through December 2018 building the new relationship through communication between St. Peter's and Busoka. In 2019 I became chairman and had the opportunity to continue the leadership of our dedicated St Peter's TMC group. We are the bridge between St. Peter's and Busoka, communicating the status of life in Busoka to our congregation, raising funds for the orphans and the Busoka community and offering weekly prayers for the people of Busoka and their orphans.

Speaking of raising funds, our largest fund raiser, the annual Cookie Walk will be held Saturday, December 10 from 9 a.m. to noon. We ask you to bake a double batch of your favorite Christmas Cookies bring them to the church between noon and 7:00 p.m. Friday, December 9 and then attend our Cookie Walk the following day.

Our commitment to Busoka and the orphans continues, but we need additional members. Please contact any TMC member if you would like to join our group in reaching across the world to our brothers and sisters in Busoka.

### **November: American Diabetes Month**



Every year, the American Diabetes Association, and communities, come together to ring the alarm on the diabetes epidemic. For the millions of us who are at risk, it is time to get educated, find resources, and make sure all those around us are aware of their risk too. For the 1.5 million Americans diagnosed with diabetes this year, it is a chance to awaken the world and share the facts. Until a cure is found, we will lift each other up and learn to live life to the fullest.

The A1C blood test: It is a powerhouse! It can identify pre-diabetes, diagnose diabetes, and help monitor your diabetes treatment over time. It's a critical step in forming your game plan to manage your diabetes. It may be done a few times a year, or more frequently, (if you're not meeting the goal you and your doctor agreed upon).



Some people may be living with diabetes and not know it. Having a fasting blood glucose (blood sugar) test is important, especially if you have a family history of diabetes or had gestational diabetes. Through blood tests, you may have been told you have pre-diabetes. For those with pre-diabetes, early treatment as well as moderate lifestyle changes, can actually return blood glucose (blood sugar) levels to normal: effectively preventing or delaying type 2 diabetes! Ask your doctor plenty of questions and listen to his/her answers. Increase your daily physical activity, start eating healthy, lose weight (if needed), and you may avoid, or delay type 2 diabetes.

For those newly diagnosed? The good news is that you have a community to fall back on. You don't have to maneuver type 2 diabetes (or type 1) alone. You have the support of countless others who have felt the same shock. This new diagnosis is simply the first step. You can manage your diabetes – through diet, exercise, medical support, and emotional help. Dig in – Take action, and know that you are surrounded by people who know exactly what you're going through and can help.

You may have been told that medicine is needed to manage your diabetes (this could be pills, or insulin injections, or both). Work with your doctor to see what (if any) medicines are necessary. Make sure you ask your doctor lots of questions about the medicine(s): how to take it, when to take it, how much to take, and any side effects or other things you should watch for as your body gets used to these necessary changes. It is important to share your feelings with those around you, and don't feel ashamed to ask for help. Reaching out to others is one of the keys to living a vital life with diabetes. Check with your doctor or hospital, who can refer you to support groups or other helpful resources. We can manage diabetes together and live a long life.

# **Church security updates**

Yarnell Security has completed the physical installation of all of our requested security system upgrades so I want to alert you to the changes and how they will affect us.

- 1. Preschool panic buttons These are the same buttons that were installed some time ago in the preschool rooms but were deactivated in the past due to false alarms triggered by kids hitting pendants that the teachers were around their necks. There is now a single button in each preschool room, Cindy Geesey's office and room 100. We will not use pendants as that risks a repeat of false alarms. Activating one of these buttons will trigger an alarm to Yarnell who will automatically dispatch the local police. The system is live now.
- 2. Four cameras have been added. They cover the narthex, the Youth lounge double door entrance from the inside, the main parking lot at the Portico end and the north entrance area of the parking lot at the old sanctuary end. The service maintains several weeks of data and is searchable if there is an incident we want to look at.
- 3. The office door now has a fob reader for access. Be aware that the office area is secured by a burglar alarm system with motion detectors. The alarm system is active based on when it is programmed to be armed which is typically the night time hours. If you have any doubts about whether the system is armed do not access the office as it will trigger an alarm. This is really only a concern during off hours like very early morning or late at night. The system is off during normal business hours. Both Sandy and JoAnn have buttons at their desks that will open the office door for entry.
- 4. The large conference room door to the outer hallway was previously another entry point to the alarmed office area. This meant that the conference room was generally locked and only available when the burglar alarm was off. This has been changed to allow more flexible use of the conference room. The outer door is no longer a secured access point. That has now been moved to the interior door between the office and conference room. This inner door will remain locked and alarmed off hours but the conference room itself can be used.
- 5. The four main entrance doors to the narthex and the two main entrance doors for New Day are now all magnetically locked, linked to the security system and opened via electronic key fobs the same ones in use today. Physical keys will no longer open these doors so we will issue fobs as needed. Use of the fobs provides superior security as they can be limited by time of day, limit which doors can be opened, can be deactivated if someone leaves and provides a record of who comes in. Those who have keys to any doors other than those six main entrance doors they will still work. Paul is able to program opening and closing of the six main doors based on the church calendar of events. The intercom to the office to request entrance remains in operation as it is today. *These six doors can no longer be manually locked open with the key or "dogged down" as we call it.* Doing that would defeat the function of the lock down buttons.

This is a significant change that we need to adapt to as many groups have become accustomed to a leader gaining entrance and then using that hex key to keep the doors unlocked. This is our single largest compromise of flexibility to increase security. Please do not prop the doors open. Instead you can work with Paul to program the doors to open for regular scheduled meetings or even one time events.

6. Emergency lock down buttons have been installed near the 4 main entrance doors to the narthex and the two doors at the New Day entrance. Activating either of these two buttons will lock all six main entrance doors, send an alarm to Yarnell and automatically dispatch the police.

What is still to come:

- The lock down buttons will be covered to limit the risk of accidental or malicious use in a non-emergency situation
- The lock down button at New Day is not yet installed
- Additional training and documentation will be provided as needed for general awareness
- Additional fobs will be issued as needed

I anticipate there will be some degree of learning curve as with any new system or change. Tightening up access to the building to improve security also means we may need to adapt to less flexibility in some cases around doors being left open. If you have questions or hear of any issues please share them with me, Paul or the staff and we will address them as quickly as we can. Thanks!



# Pastor's Letter

November is a rollercoaster here at St. Peter's. We begin the month with the sobering festival of All Saints' Sunday. While we rejoice with our forebears from church, family and friendship circles because of their joining the Church Triumphant ... the human part of us mourns their loss to this world. It is a day to celebrate the gift of eternal life, but it still brings us face to face with the specter of death in this world in which we live.

The following Sunday is the day of our Annual Congregational Meeting. We strive to fit the call to address significant moments and decisions from the past twelve months into a 60-90 minute

period of time. We also make decisions that our church constitution requires of us: approving a 2023 spending plan ... electing new Council members ... ratifying an updated church constitution (this year) ... and any recommendations from the floor that are endorsed by those church members in attendance. It is a substantive load to carry for your fellow parishioners who have volunteered to serve as officers or council members for the coming year. I invite you to read the materials that will be available to you before the meeting, so you will be familiar with the verbal reports that are offered, and so that you can celebrate with your fellow believers the incredible opportunity we have in this congregation to be a faithful, balanced and servant-minded community of faith

The third Sunday of November is Christ the King Sunday – the final Sunday of the church year. We will read our final weekly offering from St. Luke's Gospel, as we wrestle with the tension between the earthly death of Jesus at Golgotha, and the heavenly reunion Jesus experiences with the Father in heaven. It is a day that we are allowed ... and dare I say invited ... to think concretely about the Kingdom that awaits us beyond this world. Oh ... and it is also Thanksgiving Week, which while not a church holiday, is certainly a celebration that invites us to give thanks to God for our earthly and familial blessings.

The final Sunday of November brings us into a new church year ... the year of St. Matthew – and our first lesson is an invitation to again engage Jesus' words spoken in the final days of his life ... but in this case, they are words that transport us beyond this world to the one that awaits us at the end of all days. The season of Advent is so much more than just a preparation for Christmas. It is a serious engagement of the eschatological images with which Jesus confronts us, inviting us to consider how the vibrancy and potency of the next world, should shape our actions and our choices in this world. We will observe our Advent Wreath tradition, gradually decorate the church for Christmas, and probably have a baptism on one of the Sundays that celebrate the prophetic ministry of John the Baptist.

And throughout this Advent season which begins on November 27, some of us will gather on Wednesday evenings for mid-week Advent worship, and prepare for Jesus' coming to the world as both baby and savior, in ways writ large and small. We'd love for you to join us for one of those modest mid-week services of communion and homily in our Chapel each Wednesday night of Advent.


