Mission Campaign



St. Peter's Family,

As always, we appreciate your interest in staying abreast of the progress in our *Faith in Our Future* campaign.

As of mid-November, 106 households have helped us secure pledges totaling \$946,180 with pledge payments and outright gifts totaling \$553,884. Of the dollars received, \$480,000 have been allocated to the capital projects component of the campaign, almost all of which have been completed - the final project in the Family Life Center is scheduled for completion in January. Thank you for tw that has propelled us this far!

At our town hall meeting several weeks ago, one of our church family members observed that he did not see any "outreach" in the mission campaign. We appreciated hearing this observation. It is indeed true that our campaign funding effort to-date has been focused on capital needs. This means that we now can indeed fully turn our attention to the mission (outreach and service) focus of the campaign!

This three-year campaign was very strategically designed based on the feedback all of you provided when you participated in our 2019 feasibility study. The prevailing sentiment was a strong desire to tend to long-standing and critical upgrades and repairs to the exterior and interior of the church. We also learned through that study that there are individuals motivated to help pay down our mortgage debt, freeing up operating dollars for programmatic, outreach, and benevolence support. And most directly tied to outreach is the creation of the Mission Fund. To clarify some misperceptions, the Mission Fund will <u>not</u> be a source of funds to "write checks" to other organizations. Rather, it is the culmination of our commitment to Word and Deed—how do we, as members of St. Peter's, take the Good Word into the community, both near and far, to roll up our sleeves to serve others.

With the generosity and energy around the first component of the campaign as a springboard, we are very excited to shift our attention to the Mortgage Reduction and Mission Funding phase, which happens to be where each of us brings the greatest passion and energy. We will be reaching out to all households in the coming weeks to ask everyone to contribute to the debt reduction and Mission Fund priorities of the campaign. But you don't have to wait for that mail to arrive! As we look to our holiday season traditions, we ask you to consider your year-end giving to the church. My husband Paul and I have been members at St. Peter's for over 30 years. We raised our three children in this faith family where volunteering was a large part of our lives. From Strawberry Festivals, Fellowship committees, councils and church picnics we have always found joy in offering our time and talents.

As a nurse I have always wanted to help others. While working I was never able to help with the Community Meal. However now that I am retired, I have taken the role of chairperson of the Community Meals. This is an extremely rewarding mission. We currently serve meals to 75-100 persons twice a month. Meals are prepared at St. Peter's then packaged as take out and transported to Grace Lutheran in Lancaster. They are then handed out to the food underserved of the city. I have a wonderful group of people that are part of this team but we can always use more!

The Recovery Ministry was started by Vicar Nancy as her intern project. I became the chairperson shortly after its formation. COVID hit this mission very hard. We are looking forward to getting on track now that we can be in person once again. Vantage House is a branch of this ministry. This is a recovery house for women and their children. Again, St. Peter's is a big support for them. WELCA has joined in our support for this mission and has contributed personal care kits as well as gift cards for this wonderful group of women.

Despite the virus only being identified in 1984, more than 35 million people have died of HIV or AIDS related illnesses, making it one of the most destructive pandemics in history.



Fortunately, scientific advances have been made in HIV treatment, there are laws to protect people living with HIV.and we understand so much more about the condition. Despite these advances, each year thousands of people are diagnosed with HIV. People do not know the facts about how to protect themselves and others, and stigma and discrimination remain a reality for many people living with the condition.

World AIDS day is December 1. It's an opportunity for people worldwide to unite in the fight against HIV, to show support for people living with HIV/AIDS, and to commemorate those who have died from an AIDS-related illness. While it may be once a year, you can still support people living with HIV/AIDS all year. World AIDS Day is important because it reminds the public and government that HIV has not gone away – there is still a vital need to raise money, increase awareness, fight prejudice and improve education.

Getting tested is the only way to find out if you have HIV. If you are living with HIV, starting treatment early means you can live a full, healthy and productive life. Free and confidential HIV tests are available.

Buy a red ribbon

World AIDS Day is an opportunity to show solidarity with the millions of people living with HIV worldwide. Most people do this by wearing an HIV awareness red ribbon on the day.

Pastor's Letter



In darkest night his coming shall be, when all the world is despairing, as morning light so quiet and free, so warm and gentle and caring. Then shall the mute break forth in song, the lame shall leap in wonder, the weak be raised above the strong, and weapons be broken asunder. ~Awake! Awake, and Greet the New Morn, ELW 242

In general, by this time of the year, we are starting to get a little jittery about getting Christmas decorations out of the closet and on display in our homes. We are planning for parties or family visits, while shopping for presents online and in the stores. We are thinking about meals and cookie baking and maybe even crafts that we will create with the little ones in our lives. There is an anxiety that accompanies the season that for most is a bit energizing and exciting.

These days, we have other anxieties ... ones that aren't solved by the "perfect present" or the "just right" tree topper for the Frazier Fir in the corner of your living room. These days we have anxiety over the economy ... and the violence we see around the globe that can be as substantive as the war in Ukraine or as particular as the shooting that happened two streets down from your home. We struggle to find direction from political leaders whose focus sometimes appears to be more focused on re-election, than on governance. And even core activities like shopping feel unstable, as one week Giant has more toilet tissue than shelves to hold it, and other weeks those shelves are as bare as Mother Hubbard's cupboard. And it doesn't help that your favorite condiment, Temeraire French Dijon Mustard has been gone for weeks now, does it?

Even church, the place we often frequent for a spirit of sanctuary and peace, is not quite as peaceful as we like it. We're anxious that the return of members to our sanctuary for worship is not progressing as quickly as we would like ... we're nervous about sluggish offerings in a difficult economy ... we wonder what changes will result from staff position vacancies in some key areas like music and the church office. Our typically strong volunteer base has been tested, as more people engage worship from their living rooms, while others are cautious about being close to people due to health challenges in their lives.

If this is the way you view the world most mornings that you arise, then Advent is a season that should be as meaningful to you and me as any of our liturgical seasons throughout the year. Because Advent focuses upon the coming of the Prince of Peace into our world. Advent reminds us that when things seem to be the darkest, it is not because sunset is upon us, but because daybreak is just starting to crest on the horizon. Advent invites us, dare we say, "demands of us" to see our world through the eyes of one of our most robust Advent hymns, *Awake! Awake, and Greet the New Morn.* We are always people of hope, because Jesus is alive in the world through you and me. I cannot begin to hazard a guess as to what Jesus' coming means for our world, this year. I am no Pollyanna who expects magical solutions to problems that have developed over years and decades and even centuries. But I am a believer in the Lord of Life who is also the Prince of Peace – our savior who has come into our world so as to redeem and renew us in the messes we create, and save us from ourselves, if need be. During this Advent season, let us faithfully watch together for Jesus' joyous arrival in our lives.
