St. Peter's Family,

As we read in 1 Thessalonians, we continue to offer prayers and thanks for the continued progress in our *Faith in Our Future* mission campaign.

As of mid-December, 106 households have helped us secure pledges totaling \$946,180 with pledge payments and outright gifts totaling \$563,148. Of the dollars received, \$480,000 have been allocated to the capital projects component of the campaign, almost all of which have been completed -- the final project in the Family Life Center is scheduled for completion in January. 

The Prayer Chain Ministry was started in 2001 as an intern project for the then Vicar Jerry Kulp. The Prayer Chain offers intercessory prayer for our church members and for non-church members. We lift up prayers that are received from the pew cards, our website, and emails from the pastors/office. We offer prayers for one week or one month. No request is too big or too small. Intercessory prayer is a way for us to show Christian love for one another.

My family joined St. Peter's in 2001. When I was approached to be a part of the ministry, I felt it was a way to give back to God and a way to make connections with our new church. I have learned prayer is just a conversation with God. Praying for others has helped our group to make connections within our group and with those that we pray for. Health & Wellness



As we begin the new year, and start making all those resolutions, we should also think about how easily we can save lives. There are several ways to make an impact.

Many of our friends, neighbors, and those we don't know, are struggling. The holidays are often a time of sadness, loneliness and despair. These feelings prompt deeper depression, anxiety and even an increase in suicide. We are often so caught up in our own busy lives, that we don't stop to recognize how one gesture of caring and love can dramatically impact someone's day, (and maybe their life). Please take time every day, look for a way to reach out, and share God's caring and love. You will

brighten the person's day, and may just save a life.

Another way is through blood donation. January is National Blood Donor Month; a period of critical blood shortages. (The pandemic has further impacted donations). Did you know that 38% of the U.S. population can donate, but only 10% do! People will stop donating during the holidays, (November, December & winter months), and when they get sick with colds, flu, etc. Blood drives will get snowed out during the upcoming winter weather months. This is a time that we recognize the lifesaving contribution of blood and platelet donors. Without them, there are millions of people who would further decline, or die, because of the need for blood (or blood products).

As in 2021, the nation's blood supply has dipped to concerning levels. Blood donors of all blood types – particularly type O, which is needed most – are needed to help meet demands.

More than 50 years ago, on December 31, 1969, the president of the United States signed a proclamation designating January as National Blood Donor Month (NBDM). This observance was meant to honor voluntary blood donors and encourage others to give blood at a time when it's needed more than ever.

HOW TO OBSERVE NATIONAL BLOOD DONOR MONTH

<u>Donate</u>: not just in honor of national blood donor month, but in the simple spirit of providing the stuff of life to those who need it most. (You can donate again after 8 weeks, as long as you're healthy)

Inspire: those who donate can inspire others, creating an exponential increase in donations!

<u>Learn and remember your blood type</u>: Some examples: O positive (needed more often), O negative (considered universal donors), AB position (considered universal recipients), etc.

Every time we donate one pint of blood, the potential is there to save three lives. Every time we share thoughts of caring and love, the potential is there to save a life.

Hi Folks:

January is a time when many of us look to the year ahead with optimism and hope. Even though these are unusual times in which we live, there is much to celebrate and anticipate this coming year at St. Peter's.

After more than forty years of service to churches in secretarial positions – with 13+ of those years with St. Peter's, Sandy is turning off her church computers to enjoy a well-deserved retirement at the end of 2022. We cannot thank Sandy enough for her years of faithful administrative service, and her bright and joyful spirit among us. She will be deeply missed. We are excited, however, that JoAnn Harriger, our former assistant secretary, will take over the lead secretary role in our office, and our new assistant secretary will be Kristie Windle. They will job share our parish secretary position. Our hope is that you will welcome Kristie to our congregation when you meet her in the office, starting this month, and support both JoAnn and Kristie.

We have just finished our Christmas season and the end of our calendar year. Our church attendance is gradually growing stronger as more people are vaccinated, and others recognize that while worshiping from your living room is convenient, being in the presence of your sisters and brothers in faith is an irreplaceable blessing of public worship life. As I write, I am also expecting that many of you will be catching up on your offerings to the church, and that you will have participated in an"extra year-end gifts." Your generosity will enable us to be generous to the communities near and far that we serve as a congregation, along with supporting our congregational ministries.

Lastly, I am grateful for the Council's endorsement of my retirement date of June 30, 2024. So I will be with you for roughly another year and a half. That will be both a joy for me, and also a help as we make our retirement plans as a family. I offer my thanks to the Council for allowing me to stay through my original retirement date. It also allows me to serve among you through the successful completion of our Mission campaign, and then move aside for the next exciting stage of St. Peter's ministry ... at the corner of Lititz Pike and Delp ... and in the world beyond our doors.

I am excited for the new year ahead and the challenges of ministry it will present to us in a rapidly changing world. I will be grateful for your support and participation, and I look forward to seeing you "online", but especially "in church".
