Campaign Update

As we approach the two-year mark of our mission campaign, *Faith in Our Future*, we are sharing a progress report and a **call for your engagement**.

As of March 1st, 106 households have helped us secure pledges totaling \$946,180 with pledge



For those of you who were not inclined to support the interior and exterior physical plant projects of the church, NOW is the time to commit to the final two components of the mission campaign: Mortgage Reduction and Mission Fund. If you have been tracking our current operating budget, you appreciate that our mortgage debt is a significant monthly expense. Debt reduction was included in this campaign specifically because our campaign consultants heard from YOU that tending to this debt in a timely fashion was essential to allow for operating resources to be used for other ministries. For those of you who share that sentiment, we ask you to commit to the campaign at this mid-point.


