

Good Friday, April 7

11:00 a.m. — Family Stations of the Cross & Luncheon: *Journey with Jesus on Good Friday*. The one-hour service explores the fourteen stations of the cross in simpler terms so those of all ages can better understand Jesus' journey and our journey with Him.

7:00 p.m. — **Good Friday:** At the heart of this service is the passion reading according to John, which celebrates Christ's victory on the cross, and our honoring of the cross as we sing of forgiveness, healing and salvation.

Saturday, April 8

6:00 p.m. — **Easter Vigil:** On the night before Easter Day, Christians around the world gather to celebrate Christ's passage from death to life. The service includes strong signs: new fire in darkness, light spreading from the light of Christ, the water and Word of baptism, the first resurrection meal and powerful words: the great saving stories of Hebrew scriptures and the first Easter gospel.

We keep this wondrous night in the spirit of vigil, our lamps lit, awaiting Christ's coming both now and at the end of time. Alleluia! Christ is risen! And Christ will come again.

Easter Sunday, April 9

7:30 & 10:45 a.m. — Easter Sunday Traditional Worship: We celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord with Holy Communion, festive hymns and music, and the story of the empty tomb.

9:00 a.m. — **Easter Sunday Family Worship:** We celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord with Holy Communion, festive hymns and music, the story of the empty tomb and an interactive kid-friendly sermon.

10:45 a.m. — New Day Worship: The New Day Praise Band will help lead the community in festive music as we celebrate the Lord's resurrection. Special music as well as images and video will enhance the morning. The focus will be toward the transformation of death into life and our Lord's presence in our lives now and always.

This donation will be applied against the principal of our variable rate mortgage which, has now risen to 7.5% with the Federal Reserve's latest increase in March 2023.

In our final phase, all contributions to "Faith in Our Future Mission Campaign" will be allocated proportionately between debt reduction and the creation of the Mission Fund which will allow us to serve our community, both near and far. You can also donate directly to debt reduction by writing

a note in the comment section of your check "Debt – Principal" or the online giving section of our website (Option "88 Debt Reduction") then send me an email that your donation is to be applied to the principal of the variable rate mortgage. Every little bit helps. It's like chopping down a tree. With each swing of the axe, you come closer to your goal of cutting down the tree.

Please keep in mind that we still have a mortgage and interest payments due on both the variable and fixed loans that are due each month related to the 2005 construction. So, if you are currently donating to Debt Reduction, please continue to do so but you can make a second designated donation to be applied against the variable rate mortgage principal.
