A few words about hymns...

A hymn is a wonderful vehicle to express our faith in worship. Hymns have been used since bible times, which we know from Colossians 3:16 -"singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs". Scripture contains hymns, such as 1 Timothy 3:16:

He appeared in a body, was vindicated by the Spirit, was seen by angels, was preached among the nations, was believed on in the world, was taken up in glory.

God has always used melody and text to facilitate worship, as we know from the psalms. And not all hymns are old - new hymns are being composed all the time. Our faith has both a strong heritage and a bright future of singing hymns.

Most of us have at least a couple of favorite hymns. These often are hymns that were sung at a time that we can identify God's activity in our lives. For example, the hymn "O Zion, Haste" (ELW 668) has special meaning to me. We sang that hymn every evening at campmeeting one year when I was a teen, and I sensed God calling me to deeper faith during that week. That hymn always brings me back to a welcome place in my spiritual development.

I would love to hear your stories about your favorite hymns. I'm sure you would enjoy hearing them in worship, but I will not know what they are unless you tell me. If you would email me at


In addition to requesting it at a hymn sing, here are some ways you can hear your favorite hymn in worship -

- Most commonly, it could be played during the prelude (starting ten minutes before the service)
- The congregation may sing it, depending on the season and liturgical needs of our services
- It could also be a meditation, offertory, or postlude

While I can't promise that we would sing your choices in the worship service on short notice, I will work on getting them into our worship so you can hear them. If you include your phone number in your email, I'll call you to schedule your requested hymn on a week you will be present.

I look forward to receiving some hymn stories in my inbox! I would love to hear from all ages on this - children and youth can have favorite hymns just as much as their parents and grandparents. Please consider sharing your story with me.
