Why Study History in Church? By Sister Dottie

"To be ignorant of what occurred before you were born is to remain always a child. For what is the worth of human life, unless it is woven into the life of our ancestors by the records of history?" – Cicero

Too often we think of separation of church and state as keeping the secular world separate from the religious realm. But our churches and denominations have been operating within the secular world since before Jesus. The church has not always made the best choices in history and have hurt many people, usually marginalized groups and those with less power to stand up. I invite you to attend our Adult Sunday School class beginning **September 10** at 9:15 a.m. in the Conference Room, as we take a deep dive into the anti-Semitic arm of the Christian church throughout history and the cost that others have paid for the complicity of many Christians. We will follow it up with a trip to the United States Holocaust Museum in Washington, DC on September 30 . This class will then continue to look at the history of American immigration through a Gospel lens and the indigenous boarding schools operated by religious institutions.

Homes of Hope


