

LIVING IN COMMUNITY NEW DAY SERMON SERIES — **September 10**: *Matthew 18:15-20*. Jesus offers practical advice to his disciples on how individuals—and the church as a whole—should go about restoring relationships when one member has sinned against another.

We will be studying the Gospel of Mark, which is the Gospel we will be reading in our worship services starting in December. The class meets from 9:30-11:00 a.m. in the Café.
