Key Notes to this Financial Report:

- Weekly Offerings through November are \$184,825 under budget.
- Year-to-date expenses are under budget by \$37,412; however, a portion of that is for budgeted benevolence commitments, not yet paid for 2023.
- Due to cash flow concerns, we are only submitting 80% of our local benevolence commitment to the Synod on a month-to-month basis.
- Finance Committee plans to pay all budgeted benevolence commitments in December 2023. Approximately \$34,113 as of 11/30/23.

Remember, this is the only way to avoid taxes on Required Minimum Distributions.
